

Indian forces to break Manipur blockade

India will send paramilitary troops yesterday to end a blockade of a northeastern state by tribal groups that has cut food and medical supplies for over two months, a top official said.

Several Naga tribal groups have blocked the main highways into Manipur state since April 12 to protest against a government decision preventing their separatist leader, Thuingaleng Muivah, from visiting his birthplace.

Government officials say they have only got two food convoys into the state since the start of the protest, sending food prices soaring, while hospitals have run perilously low on essential medical supplies.

"The process would begin from Tuesday and we shall see to it that food supplies reach Manipur," Home Secretary GK Pillai, the senior civil servant in the interior ministry, told AFP from New Delhi.

Muivah's National Socialist Council of Nagaland has been campaigning for decades for a Naga homeland to be carved out from three of India's seven northeastern states, including Manipur.

The Manipur government had banned 75-year-old Muivah's trip to his home village, saying it could stoke unrest. On May 6, six tribal protesters were killed and up to 70 injured during demonstrations over the ban.

"The central government's decision to use

force to break the deadlock has come in late, but still we welcome the move," N Biren Singh, senior minister and Manipur government spokesman, told AFP from Manipur's capital Imphal.

In New Delhi on Monday, a delegation led by Mutsikhoyo Yohubu, the president of the Nagaland Student Federation, which has spearheaded the blockade, met Prime Minister Manmohan Singh and other top political figures.

Manipur, which has long been affected by insurgent violence, is home to dozens of tribal groups and small guerrilla armies that resist rule from New Delhi and often compete against each other.

Meanwhile, a delegation of senior Naga leaders is expected to call on Prime Minister Dr Manmohan Singh here this evening in an attempt to find a solution for the economic blockade.

The Naga tribes have been imposing economic blockade since mid-April on National Highways 39 and 53 to oppose the election, and support the proposed visit of NSCN (IM) leader, Thuingaleng Muivah.

The All Naga Students' Association (ANSAM) had launched the blockade to protest holding of elections to six autonomous district councils which, it alleged, were against not given enough power to carry out development works.

Maoists 'killed' in Indian operation

Rail divisions asked to be on alert during strike

Police in the north-eastern Indian state of Jharkhand say they have killed 10 Maoist rebels.

Eight rebel camps were destroyed during what is being described as a major offensive in the Borahat jungles of West Singhbhum district, officials said.

Six policemen injured in the operation were airlifted to hospital, police said.

Authorities have been under pressure following a wave of Maoist-led violence in recent months.

Meanwhile, Rail divisions across the state have been alerted on threat to trains during the Maoist called 48-hour bandh, which began midnight, in five states including Jharkhand. "We have been asked to be on alert by our higher authorities following information of threat to trains," Divisional Rail Manager of the Dhanbad Rail Division, A S Upadhyaya told PTI over phone.

Asked about a local TV news report that there was also a threat by Jaish-e-Mohammad targeting Gujarat-bound trains, he said, "it's a general alert. We share intelligence inputs."

"The Maoists have called the shutdown in protest against the arrest of Sheetalji, a cadre. Several trains have been diverted to avoid Maoist- pockets during the bandh, railway sources said."

In late May, more than 145 people were killed when a train crashed in neighbouring West Bengal state after Maoist rebels allegedly sabotaged the rail track.

State-run broadcaster All India Radio reports that some 2,000 policemen are taking part in the current operation against the rebels in Jharkhand.

No Pakistan victory in Orakzai despite hue and cry

It was a classic case of military hubris: when Pakistan announced it has defeated Taliban militants in one of their major bases recently, it was a far cry from reality in the volatile Orakzai region.

Pakistani military analysts say the victory announcement -- much like US President George W Bush's 2003 "mission accomplished" moment -- was based on "miscalculations" as officers thought militants would flee the region after many of their bases were captured.

They said the declaration itself appeared to be an attempt to boost the morale of a public suffering from years of attacks, nearly constant military campaigns and few apparent results.

"The announcement looks good to the Pakistani public. The public thinks it's an endless thing, especially in Orakzai. So they probably wanted to give the people some relief," said retired general Talat Masood, a military and security analyst.

"It was for domestic consumption. But unfortunately, this was not really the reality and their credibility is now in question."

"I think it was an honest misjudgement and some unnecessary exuberance."

Orakzai is one of the major bases of the Pakistani Taliban, which are fighting both the Pakistani state and coalition forces in Afghanistan. The precarious situation in the region highlights the challenges the Pakistani army faces in battling insurgents.

Security forces last month captured the major militant stronghold of Djabori, some 60 km (37 miles) from Orakzai's main town of Kalaya.

Soon afterwards, the Pakistan army chief, Gen Asfaq Kayani, flew to Orakzai on June 1 and declared victory over the Taliban there, saying it is winding up its offensive there as militants have been driven out of the region.

But just a day later, fierce clashes broke out in which 20 militants were killed.

"The situation is very dangerous in Orakzai. The militants are still controlling important mountains and they can stage a comeback," said tribal elder Lal Jan.

NEPAL'S POLITICAL CRISIS

Party leaders revolt against Prachanda

A day after central office bearers of the Unified Communist Party of Nepal-Maoists (UCPN-M) decided that party chairman Prachanda would head the national unity government, senior leaders in the party spoke out against him.

At least six politburo and central committee members have apprised the party leadership of their dissatisfaction with the way the central office bearers hosted by Prachanda at his residence decided to make him the candidate to head the national unity government when it is formed. They also said that the decision went against the assurance that Prachanda had given in May 2009, soon after he quit as Prime Minister.

"In any future opportunity available for the party to head the government, Baburam Bhattarai will be fielded on behalf of the party," Prachanda had said.

Maoist leaders said that the decision was a breach of trust and clear instance of "lust for power". "We will raise this issue in the politburo and the central committee," a politburo member told The Indian Express.

Dinanath Sharma, Barshaman Pun Anant, Netra Bikram Chand Piblab, Devendra Paudel Sunil, Hishila Yami, Ram Karki and Top Bahadur Rayamjahi are among the senior leaders who have decided to go against Prachanda if necessary to dissuade him from staking the leadership.

The Communist Party of Nepal-Unified Marxist Leninist (CPN-UML) and Nepali Congress have already said that they would not accept the Maoists heading the new government.

Meanwhile on Friday, Indian Ambassador to Nepal Rakesh Sood met Prime Minister Madhav Nepal to discuss "latest politics" in the aftermath of the extension of the Constituent Assembly tenure.

They rather resorted to courts, and obtained injunctions against the penalties.

Quantum Power was awarded with a 110MW power project in Bheramara, while RZ Power got a 50MW plant in Thakurgaon.

On June 1, anticipating the delay, RZ Power formally informed PDB that it will need two to three weeks more beyond the June 4 deadline to commercially launch its plant.

RZ explained that it was purchasing transformers from an Indian manufacturer, and the equipment were supposed to reach Bangladesh by late May. But the manufacturer could not supply the equipment before early June. So RZ will need 15 to 20 additional days to launch the plant.

On the other hand, Quantum Power did not forewarn PDB about any delay, and it has yet to respond to the board's notice of default.

"Our project is being delayed because of security threats from three different groups of criminals," said Animesh Kundu, chief of Quantum Power and Otobi, explaining the company's official position about the delay in implementing the project in Bheramara.

According to Kundu, the three groups have been asking for money, and threatening the people working at the site. Because of the threats, 10 Chinese technicians of the project refused to work in three shifts. But in order to meet the deadline, all work must be carried out in three shifts instead of the present two.

"Honestly, at this rate, we will need three more months to complete the project," Kundu said.

The contracts gave the companies 120 days each to implement the rental power projects -- which should be easy to install and dismantle. However, the Bheramara plant is being set up like a conventional power plant, which is more complicated and time consuming to install.
