Invest in power, energy, shipbuilding

PM urges Swedish businessmen

UNB, Dhaka

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina has urged Swedish businessmen to invest in the power, energy and shipbuilding sectors in Bangladesh.

The prime minister made the appeal during her meeting with the outgoing Swedish ambassador Britt Falkman Hagstorm at Ganobhaban.

She said the Swedish businessmen could invest in renewable energy, power generation, oil, gas and mineral exploration, ICT, tourism, telecommunications, roads and highways, agro industry, leather, textiles, electronics, and significantly in shipbuilding sectors.

Press Secretary to the Prime Minister Abul Kalam Azad briefed reporters after

the meeting. Hasina requested the ambassador to help Bangladesh in facilitating work for skilled professionals in EU and in Sweden. She mentioned that Sweden could support development of institutions to train and develop skilled professionals as nurses,

hotel and hospitality professionals with mechanisms for employing them in Sweden and other EU countries.

She also stressed the expansion of trade between the two countries.

In 2008-09 fiscal, exports from Bangladesh to Sweden totaled \$221 million. She mentioned that Sweden could import more woven garments, knitwear, footwear, special textiles, handicrafts, shrimps, ceramics, small and mediumsized ships, and pharmaceuticals.

Hasina thanked Sweden for keeping Bangladesh in its shortlist of August 2007 for assistance, which has been targeting rural development, primary and nonformal education, primary health care, and institutionalisation of the democratic process.

She sought scholarships for youths and urged more intensified cooperation in culture and tourism by making hotels and resorts with encouragement for Swedish

She urged Swedish support for climate change adaptation and mitigation programmes with financing and transfer of eco-friendly technology.

She told the Swedish ambassador that for the very first time the country is going to adopt an education policy.

She also mentioned that her government is working hard to strengthen democracy in the country. She thanked the donor countries, including Sweden, and agencies for their support in restoring democracy in the country and their assistance for the voter list project, as well as procurement of transparent ballot boxes.

Hagstrom hailed the role of the prime minister for her leadership in the climate change issue.

In this connection she mentioned how Bangladesh and Sweden have jointly created a bilateral fund worth \$11 million. She said she is very much impressed at

7 killed in road crashes

At least seven people were killed and 23 others injured in separate road accidents in Narsingdi, Bagerhat and Kishoreganj yesterday.

Our Narsingdi correspondent says: Four people were killed and 10 others injured in a head-on collision between a bus and truck in Sristyghar area under Shibpur upazila of the district.

The deceased were identified as Dr Milia Rahman, 25, Sankar Bhoumik, 45, Latif Babu, 18, and an unidentified man aged about 32.

Officer-in-Charge of Shibpur model Police station Badrul Alam said the accident took place when a Dhaka-bound passenger bus collided head-on with a Bhairab-bound truck on Dhaka-Sylhet highway, leaving four dead on the spot.

The injured were rushed to the Narsingdi Sadar hospital.

Our Bagerhat correspondent adds: at least two people were killed and six others injured when a passenger bus hit a pick-up van on Bagerhat-Pirojpur highway under Morelganj upazila in the district.

The victims were identified as Mobarak Ali Khan, 45, and Rubel Sheikh, 22.

Mohishpura police camp said the accident

Of the injured two were admitted to Khulna Medical College Hospital and others to the Barisal Medical College Hospital.

A correspondent from Kishoreganj reports One was killed and seven others were injured in a road accident in Agarpur area in Kuliarchar upazila yesterday.

The deceased was identified as truck driver Lutfur Rahman, 28, of Tangail and the injured bus passengers are Mizan, 28, Shamim, 22, Abdul Kuddus, 45, Saiful Islam, 30, Momtaj Begum, 25, Shafiqul Islam, 30, and Abdul Qaium,28.

Of them, Mizan was admitted to Jahuru Islam Medical college Hospital in critical condition while others were admitted to Kuliarchar health complex.

Sources said the accident took place at 7:00am when a Kishoreganj-bound bus from Dhaka collided head-on with a Dhakabound jackfruits-laden truck from Madhupur. Lutfur succumbed to his inju-Sub-Inspector Sadhan Kumar Das of ries while he was being taken to Dhaka in critical condition.

Middlemen eat up lion's share of profit from raw jute men, there was turbulence in the jute mar-

Jute and Textile Minister Abdul Latif Siddiqui said in Parliament yesterday that the middlemen eat up the lion's share of profit from jute produced with toil by the farmers.

Replying to a written question of Nazim Uddin Ahmed (BNP-Laxmipur), he said the government never fixed the price for jute.

"The butter and cake always go to the middlemen whatever the price in domestic and international market, and the last season was no different," Latif Siddiqui said.

1500 per maund for their jute according to quality, he added.

The jute minister said due to the high demand in the international market and raw jute already in the hands of middle-

ket last season. "Raw jute traded at a rate of Tk 2800." He also said this kind of price is never

expected at any cost, as the farmers never benefit from such high price.

Responding to another written question from the same lawmaker, Latif Siddiqui said Bangladesh exported 17.5 lakh bales and 15.02 lakh bales of jute respectively in fiscal 2008-09 and 2009-10 (till May).

He said China, India and Pakistan were the main importers o Bangladeshi raw jute. Bangladesh also exported jute to Vietnam, North Korea, The farmers get an average of Tk 900-Tk South Korea, Russia, Spain, Germany, the USA, Ivory Coast, Belgium, Indonesia, Djibouti, Malaysia, El Salvador, Italy, Taiwan, the UK Thailand, Iran, Brazil, the Philippines, Tunisia and Nepal.

US keen to work with Bangladesh

Says Congressman
