### Two die for 'medical negligence' Doctor sent to jail

Two patients, including a pregnant woman, died due to alleged negligence of doctors in two separate incidents in Panchagarh and Dinajpur districts on Thursday and yesterday.

A doctor was also sent to jail following a court order over the death of the pregnant woman, while three persons were injured in a scuffle between relatives of a patient and interns at Dinajpur Medical College and Hospital.

Tahera Begum, 20, who was expecting, died at Panchagarh Mother and Child Welfare Centre Thursday evening. She was admitted there with labour pain in the morning, reports our Thakurgaon correspondent.

# Nimtoli blaze left some things intact

Mohammad Didar had given his eight-yearold daughter Ardita a piggy bank to save coins. The plastic bank was intact inside a wardrobe when all three members of his nuclear family died inside the flat in the Nimtoli inferno on June 3.

Didar also lost 11 members of his extended family in the blaze.

"I gave the bank to my daughter as she wanted it. She would put coins into it and kept the bank inside the wardrobe," said Didar.

Ardita, who was a class-II student of the city's Udayan Girls' School, died in the inferno that engulfed eight residential buildings and over 20 shops at Nimtoli of Old Dhaka. The blaze left 121 dead.

Surprisingly, much of the furniture, clothes, documents, stored money and the other belongings of the residents of that building remained unscathed. Only the

furniture of one flat of the eight-flat fivestorey building was burnt but all the 41 people who were inside the building on that night of horror had died.

Sofas, beds, cots, almirah, wardrobes and other furniture inside the seven flats of the building, owned by Didar and his two brothers, seemed not to have received a scratch.


They now call up memories of the people who once used them.

"I found intact Tk 500 and Tk 100 notes inside the wardrobe," said Didar who used to stay in a third-floor flat with his wife and two children. He said clothes and other stuff inside the wardrobe were in perfect condition too.

He collected them Thursday.

Documents and other papers in another flat owned by Didar's brother Mohammad Gulzar on the fourth floor were also found intact. Gulzar collected the documents last week.

# Provide more manpower to speed up war crimes trial

## Speakers at Nirmul Committee confce ask govt

STAFF CORRESPONDENT

The government should appoint more investigators and prosecutors soon to expedite the process of war crimes trial, said speakers in a conference yesterday.

"It is right that the government has formed a tribunal for trying war criminals. But lack of logistics is delaying the investigation and trial process," Prof Muntasir Mamun said in the national conference of Ekattorer Ghatak Dalal Nirmul Committee at the auditorium of the Institution of Engineers, Bangladesh.

He said the government must provide all necessary logistics, and appoint more investigators and prosecutors for holding the trial immediately.

The speakers demanded that the identified war criminals must be arrested before the start of the trial to prevent them from misleading people through propaganda.

"There is a provision in the existing law that allows detaining those harmful to the society. The government should consider it with regard to war criminals," said Prof Kabir Chowdhury, president of the advisory committee of Ekattorer Ghatak Dalal Nirmul Committee.

is a crime against humanity and the provisions of existing laws can be applied against those accused of war crimes," said Mujahidul Islam Selim, general secretary of the Communist Party of Bangladesh.

Giving an example, he said Germany arrested the lieutenants loyal to Adolf Hitler before the Nuremberg trial began.

Lawmaker Hasanul Haque Inu said the present global stage is appropriate for trying war criminals with Rwanda, Bosnia and Cambodia holding war crimes trials.

Lawmaker Rashed Khan Menon said formation of a tribunal is not enough to

ensure war crimes trial. The masses must be involved in the process.

LGRD and Cooperatives Minister Syed Ashraful Islam said, "Those who muddle up the issue of commodity prices with the trial do not want that the war criminals are tried."

"The June 27 hartal has nothing to do "War crime is not a general offence. It with the prices of essentials. It is a rehearsal for protecting the war criminals."


