

Afridi toys with Tigers

Afridi plundered 17 boundaries and four sixes to lead Pakistan to their highest one-day total of 385-7, before Bangladesh replied with 246-5 in

the day-night match. Junaid Siddique top-scored for Bangladesh with 97 after sharing a second-wicket stand of 160 with Imrul Kayes, who made 66.

It was Pakistan's lone victory in the fournation tournament and came after India and defending champions Sri Lanka had already qualified for Thursday's final with two wins

Bangladesh return home beaten in all three matches.

India and Sri Lanka clash in the last league match on Tuesday to prepare for the final at the Rangiri stadium in Dambulla.

Pakistan's total surpassed their previous best of 371-9 against Sri Lanka in Nairobi in 1996, a match in which Afridi cracked the fastest one-day century ever off 37 balls.

Wimbledon underway

The Wimbledon tennis championships got underway Monday with

defending champion Roger Federer going in search of his seventh title, while comeback girl Kim Clijsters got off to a flying start.

The men's defending champion is always the first to play on the pristine grass of Centre Court, and Swiss top seed Federer began his campaign against Colombia's Alejandro Falla.

Women's defending champion Serena Williams gets her campaign underway against Portuguese teenager Michelle Larcher de Brito.

Belgian eighth seed Clijsters, who spent more than two years out of the game, marked her return to the All England Club with a quick, straight sets victory over Italy's

Maria Elena Camarin. Women's 11th seed Marion Bartoli, 12th seed Nadia Petrova and 21st seed Vera Zvonareva also went through to the second

round in straight sets. The winners of this year's

Wimbledon singles' titles will who lost the women's final to net one million pounds (1.48 her sister Serena last year, million dollars, 1.2 million euros) in prize money after a credit-crunch defying increase of 150,000 pounds.

The total prize money for the event stands at 13.725 million pounds.

Taiwan's Chan Yung-Jan got the first win of the championships, downing Swiss veteran Patty Schnyder, who was playing in her 56th Grand Slam. Chan reached the second round for the first time with a 6-0, 6-2 win.

Later on Centre Court, women's fourth seed Jelena Jankovic was to face teenage British wild card Laura Robson, who won the 2008 girls' singles.

Jankovic's fellow Serb Novak Djokovic, the men's third seed, was then to face

Belgium's Olivier Rochus. Last year's beaten finalists

started their campaign on Number One Court.

US number one Andy Roddick, who lost one of the all-time greatest finals in a knife-edge 16-14 fifth set duel with Federer, was up against compatriot Rajeev Ram.

South Africa's grip on the second Test against West Indies was weakened on Sunday after Shivnarine Chanderpaul and Brendan Nash hit hundreds.

Chanderpaul was undefeated on the top score so far of 151 and Nash made 114, as West Indies reached 424 for four, replying to the South Africans' first innings total of 543 for six declared, at the close on the third day.

The Proteas' bowlers were hamstrung by the friendly Warner Park pitch, and Chanderpaul and Nash filled their troughs in a stand of 220 for the fourth wicket that helped West Indies avoid the follow-on.

"We seem to feed off each other well," said Nash o Chanderpaul. "We've had a few good partnerships in the previous Tests we've played."

"He [Chanderpaul] gives you the calm at the other end, like the rock in the foundation. That instills so much confidence in you at the other end."

Chanderpaul got to his 22nd Test hundred from 188 balls, sixth in the 87th minute with a square drive for two off Dale Steyn, the same bowler that before Tiago rubbed salt in Nash pulled through square leg for the 12th of his 14 fours to the Korean wounds with a reach his second Test hundred from 129 deliveries.

Vintage Brazil, biteless Italy

South America's World Cup kept getting better, Africa's miseries were compounded, and another shock result established upsets as the norm in the first round of this World Cup. On Sunday, sixtimes world champions Brazil turned in a vintage performance to brush aside Ivory Coast 3-1 in their group H encounter, while in group F Paraguay made easy work of meek Slovakia in a 2-0 victory, but the biggest result came when the reigning champions Italy failed to break the wall of New Zealand in their entertaining 1-1 draw.

On Sunday night in Johannesburg, Dunga's men turned in glimpses of champagne football as if to reassure that the Joga Bonito is still very much alive and they can produce it at will if they have the luxury.

There was Joga Bonito written all over the first and the third goal while the second one was a fortunate one, albeit skillfully done. Kaka's return to some semblance of form was a relief for Dunga, but his un-edifying sending off did not go down well with the coach.

It was expected that the Ivorians would not pose as

stiff a challenge as the North Koreans due to their attacking style of play, and it turned out to be so as Sven Goran Eriksson fielded an attacking formation of 4-3-3, leaving their defense unguarded often enough for pacy Robinho, Kaka and Fabiano to take full advantage of.

Having confirmed second round with a match to play, Dunga will have his playmaker Kaka and hopefully Elano too back in the side in time for the second round match.

Dunga's Brazil have

already won the Copa America and the Confederations Cup last year, and on the evidence of Sunday night's play, they look like having it in them to take a sixthWorld cup crown.

To whom the crown currently belongs to, are in jeopardy of having to relinquish it very early in the tournament, after another futile albeit entertaining performance against tiny New Zealand.

The Azzurris have not won a single game so far in 2010, and one wonders where that win would come from. In both the games they played, they had to come from behind after conceding early goals from set pieces. The Italians who were expected to be good in defending set-pieces gifted two easy goals to the opposition, courtesy of weary legs at the back. And it was only good fortune that they managed to equalise in both games, against Paraguay it was a penalty that saved their

blushes.

On Sunday's match, the tall and stocky New Zealanders used their physical advantage to cancel out any threat from aerial ball played inside their penalty box. Even when the last line of defence was breached goalkeeper produced the heroics to deny the world champions any success. Italians might have done better had they tried to unlock the defence taking the ball through dribbles or threading balls but they hardly have the quality of Robinho or Kaka to do so. Andrea Pirlo's absence makes their case only harder.

Italy enjoyed 72 percent of possession, earned 15 corners against zero to the kiwis, and had five shots on target to only one from their opponents, yet there was only despair at the end of ninety minutes.

(4) Overall, the aerodynamic performance of the Teamgeist ball is better compared to the Jabulani ball.

Also, important to note is that the Jabulani ball is not perfectly smooth as it has special ridges on its surface along with seams between the panels. As the airflow passes over the ball, the ridges and seams generate asymmetric airflow creating pressure variation around the ball. This pressure variation can cause deviation from the expected flight trajectory. This deviation is what is commonly referred to as swerve, swoop or knuckle etc.

The average altitude of six cities of the total ten stadium cities of South Africa is 1350 m from the sea level. The study indicates that high altitude will have significant effect on the ball's aerodynamic drag and speed.

For example, at 90 km/h ball speed in calm wind condition at high altitude stadiums in South Africa, the Jabulani ball's air resistance can be around 13% less compared to the sea level stadium cities such as Cape Town or Durban. As a result, the ball can travel at 7% higher speed on average in high altitude cities. However, in Johannesburg, which is 1750 m above sea level, the Jabulani ball can travel almost 10% higher compared to sea level stadium cities in South Africa. Therefore, the players can overshoot the ball.
