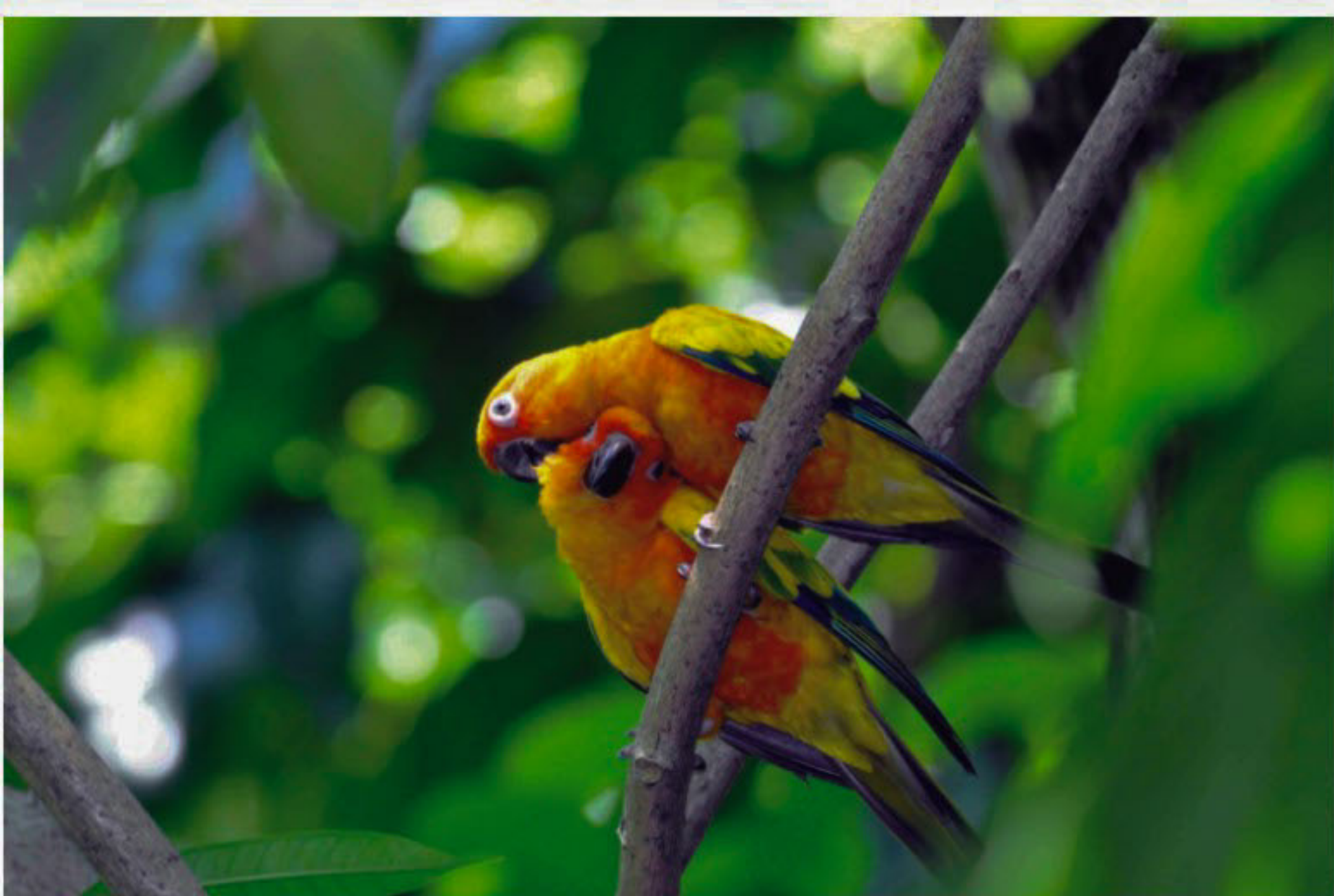

A weeklong solo photography exhibition of amateur photographer Dr. Niaz Rahman on birds began at Drik Gallery, Dhanmondi, on June 25. Titled "Rhythmic Wing Beats" (Pakhaye Pakhaye Chhando), the exhibition features over 70 photographs on different species of birds. "I took photographs of birds whenever and wherever I got an opportunity. During my overseas travels, I

snapped rare birds that would never be seen in Bangladesh," said Dr. Niaz Rahman, an eye specialist. "I am not a professional photographer. It never occurred to me that I would exhibit my photographs. I simply love to take snaps," he added. The exhibited photographs highlight mainly three species of birds--Bangladeshi native birds, migratory birds that come to our country in winter and birds seen on foreign soil and that never appear in our country.

The photographs depict the birds in their diversity of poise and colour. An inauguration programme was held at the venue. Eminent cultural personality and photography enthusiast Aly Zaker inaugurated the exhibition as chief guest. Noted litterateur Mustafa Nurul Islam and reputed nature photographer Sadat Hossain Salim were special guests. The inaugural ceremony was presided over by educationist Professor Rowshan Ara Rahman. "The pleasure of photography is that it will take you closer to nature.

Where day by day our lifestyle becomes more artificial in this concrete urban jungle, photography may give you some relief for a while," said Sadat Hossain Salim. Dr. Rahman has captured on his lens photographs of birds such as the Nicobar Pigeon, which are globally threatened with extinction. He has also taken photographs of very common birds of Bangladesh, which too are on display. The exhibition will remain open everyday from 3pm to 8pm till July 2.
