Physiotherapy students' memo to PM today

Bangladesh Physiotherapy Students' Union (BPSU) will march towards the Prime Minister's Office at 12:00 noon today to submit a memorandum to the Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina as part of their agitation programmes, says a press release.

More than 200 physiotherapy students have been staging hunger strike from June 21 to press their demand for a Bangladesh College of Psychotherapy.

On the 8th consecutive day of the hunger strike, a group of health officials of the ministry and directorate general of health services (DGHS) met the protesters on behalf of the health minister at 2:00pm at the Central Shaheed Minar and requested them to call off their hunger strike.

Dr Khandaker Mohammad Shefayeatullah, director (medical education) of DGHS, and Ahsanul Haque Khan Swapan, deputy chief engineer (health wing) of architecture department, talked to the students. But they did not assure the students of establishing a separate college of physiotherapy.

Meanwhile, around 70 students fell sick during the last seven days of hunger strike and many of them are receiving treatment at different city hospitals.

Carbon storage faces leak dilemma, says study

Dreams of braking global warming by storing carbon emissions from power plants could be undermined by the risk of leakage, according to a study published yesterday.

Rich countries have earmarked tens of billions of dollars of investment in carbon capture and storage (CCS), a technology that is still only at an experimental stage.

Under CCS, carbon dioxide (CO2) would be snared at source from plants that are big burners of oil, gas and coal.

Instead of being released into the atmosphere, where it would contribute to global warming, the gas would be buried in the deep ocean or piped into underground chambers such as disused gas fields.

Police maintain law and order during hartal: DMP

The police arrested a total of 167 people from different areas in the city during dawn-to-dusk hartal on charges of obstructing the police, blocking the roads, vandalising shops and vehicles and issuing threats.

The arrestees include former BNP minister Mirza Abbas, lawmaker Shaheed Uddin Chowdhury Annee, former state minister Prof MA Mannan, Shamsher Mobin Chowdhury and Advocate Ahmed Azam Khan, the Dhaka Metropolitan Police (DMP) said in a press release last night.

The DMP also claimed that the police maintained law and order in the city during the hartal and normal situation has now been prevailing.

It said Mirza Abbas was arrested from his Shahjahanpur residence at noon yesterday in connection with torching of a vehicle at Bijoynagar on Saturday evening after a case was filed in this connection. During the arrest, his supporters also attacked the law enforcers, injuring six policemen.

A case was also filed against Mirza Abbas with Motijheel Police Station in connection with bomb blasts during the hartal period. Preliminary investigations revealed that vehicles

were vandalised and torched in different areas of the city on Saturday at the directives of Mirza Abbas, the press release said.

At around 9:00am, BNP leaders and activists led by BNP lawmaker Shahid Uddin Chowdhury Annee ransacked Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujib Medical University and attacked their rivals. When the law enforcers arrived at the scene, unruly people attacked them, leaving four policemen injured.

At around 7:15am, former state minister Prof MA Mannan and advocate Ahmed Azam Khan led a procession of pickets and held a rally, blocking a road near Petro Bangla office at Karwan Bazar. Some rickshaws were also damaged at that time. The two leaders also gave threat to policemen, the press release added.

At around 11:00am, the DMP said, around 150 people led by Shamsher Mobin Chowdhury attacked the law enforcers in Mohakhali Wireless Gate area, injuring six policemen. The pickets also damaged rickshaws and beat up pedestrians, creating a panic during the hartal.

Unruly people also clashed with the police in different areas including Kaptan Bazar, Shaheed Faruk Road and Jagannath University areas. The police charged batons and fired tear gas shells to disperse the pickets.

FOREIGN SHIP DETAINED IN INDIA

News misleading Says army headquarters

The Army Headquarters termed misleading the news item headlined "Foreign ship detained in India after offloading arms in Chittagong," published in a section of dailies here yesterday.

Quoting Army Headquarters statement, Inter Service Public Relations (ISPR) press release said MV Aegean Glory carrying military equipment of some contingents along with a battalion under the supervision of UN returned to Chittagong port on June 15 after accomplishing their task for the United Nations mission in Liberia.

It said on June 24, the ship left the port after offloading the equipment from June 19-23 under the supervision of local shipping agent Messrs Sunshine Business Limited. Among the equipment, 32 containers carried war weapons and military vehicles.

The military equipment are being handed over from Chittagong port to Bangladesh Army in Dhaka Cantonment under the supervision of UN-nominated shipping agent Sunshine Business Limited, the press release said.

The same ship also carried some military equipment for \(\begin{aligned}

"I don't believe in a big

"Kevin Rudd indicated that he had a view about a big Australia, I'm indicating a different approach. I think we want an Australia that is sustainable," she told the Nine Network.


Rudd had expressed optimism about a "big Australia" with a population of more than 36 million people by 2050, achieved through rising birth rates and immigration.


