Dutch stun Brazil

Uruguay ends Ghana's dream

Wesley Sneijder headed a second-half winner as Netherlands battled back from a goal down to beat ten-man Brazil 2-1 on Friday and secure a place in the World Cup semifinals.

Brazil, the five-times champions, took a 10th minute lead through Robinho and dominated the first-half against a Dutch team which initially looked outclassed.

But the Dutch levelled out of the blue in the 53rd minute after a rare mistake from Brazil's usually impenetrable defence, as Felipe Melo headed Sneijder's cross into his own goal.

Then Sneijder headed a winner as the Dutch, battling to their 13th successive World Cup win to maintain a perfect record in the qualifiers and finals, avenged a quarterfinal defeat in 1994 and a semifinal defeat four years later.

"In the changing-room at half-time, everyone said to each other 'let's give everything' and that's what we did. We fought for each other," Sneijder told a television reporter after the match.

"In the second half, we put a lot of pressure on their defence and to score twice was fantastic."

He added: "We're in the last four of the world. To beat Brazil 2-1 in the quarterfinal, you have to be pleased with that. But in the next days, we will have to get our heads in focus again."



DB focuses on 'subversion' plot

Detained Jamaat leaders Ali Ahsan Mohammad Mojahid and Delwar Hossain Sayedee have been quizzed about an alleged plot to destabilise the government to prevent war crimes trial.

A top police official, who is in the interrogation team, told The Daily Star yesterday they questioned the two along that line as intelligence reports say Jamaat had tried to create anarchy cashing in on incidents like the BDR mutiny and violence in Rangamati and Khagrachhari.

The Jamaat duo kept mum when investigators produced some evidence of instigation in the hills unrest, added the official who would not be identified talking about the matter. Earlier on Thursday, police took Mojahid

and Sayedee to the Detective Branch headquarters for questioning in a case filed with the Paltan Police Station for violence and obstructing their work in February. Along with Jamaat Ameer Motiur Rahman

Nizami, Secretary General Mojahid and Nayeb-

e-Ameer Sayedee were detained on June 29.

The following day they were placed on 16 days' remand in five cases.

Nizami has yet to face quizzing as he is reported to be sick in central jail.

During interrogation that ended on Thursday night, investigators asked Mojahid and Sayedee if Jamaat has been liaising with banned Islamist outfit Hizb-ut Tahrir to wage an anti-government propaganda campaign.

They also wanted to know whether they have any links to banned militant organisation Jama'atul Mujahideen Bangladesh. On both occasions, the Jamaat leaders

replied in the negative. To another query, they said they have noth-

ing to do with those who have deserted Jamaat and joined JMB. Shahidul Haque, officer-in-charge of Paltan

Police Station, said interrogators grilled the Jamaat leaders about their alleged involvement in subversive activities during the June 27 hartal and the night before.

BNP confused about its stance

The emerging possibility that the three arrested Bangladesh Jamaat-e-Islami top brass might be prosecuted for war crimes, has put BNP in a quandary about how to participate in the movement for freeing its allied Islamist leaders. The government's moves following the arrests of Jamaat

Ameer Motiur Rahman Nizami, Secretary General Ali Ahsan Mohammad Mojahid, and Nayeb-e-Ameer Delwar Hossain Sayedee gave rise to a speculation among political circles that the three might be prosecuted for war crimes.

A majority of BNP leaders feel it would be wise for the party to be extremely cautious about extending all out support for war crime suspects likely to go on trial, said party insiders.

Although BNP Chairperson Khaleda Zia, in a written statement on Thursday, condemned the arrests and demanded the trio's release after Jamaat had sought all out help from its key ally, BNP leaders are however divided over active participation in street demonstrations to free the three.

The BNP leaders do not want their party to be perceived by the public as one that extends support to war crime suspects, if by any chance events veer towards war crime trials.

They first want to wait and see whether the government has

42 killed in Lahore suicide attack

Pakistan's second city Lahore was on high alert yesterday after two suicide bombers blew themselves up in an Islamic shrine packed with worshippers, killing 42 people and wounding scores more.

Pakistan's Taliban, which has been instrumental in a wave of deadly attacks blamed on Islamist militants over the past three years, denied it was involved in Thursday's bombing in the heart of the country's cultural capital.

Footage from the scene of the carnage at a shrine dedicated to a Sufi saint showed crowds of panicked worshippers fleeing in all directions as a huge blast sent clouds of smoke into the air.

"I saw dead bodies and injured people lying on the floor in pools of blood," said one witness. Television pictures showed bloodied clothes strewn on the ground outside the heavily damaged shrine and people crying and beating

their chests in despair.
