



Patriotism and devotion unbound

Rajanikanta Sen (1865-1910) poet, lyricist and singer, was born in the village of Bhangabari in Pabna (now in Bangladesh). Yesterday marked his 145th birth anniversary.

Rajanikanta was the author of "Pathachintamani," a book of Kirtan songs, and "Abhay Bihar," a book of lyrical poems. His father Guruprasad Sen served as a sub-judge in many parts of Bengal. Rajanikanta was tutored by his father in music from early childhood. After obtaining his BA and BL (1891) degrees from Calcutta City College, he began to practice law in Rajshahi.

Rajanikanta demonstrated his poetic power at the early age of 15 by composing songs dedicated to the goddess Kali. He used to sing his compositions at the house of Akshay Kumar Maitreya. The monthly Utsaha used to publish his writings. Devotion and patriotism formed the primary themes of his poems



and songs, although he also composed love songs and satirical verses. One of his songs composed during the Swadeshi movement, "Mayer Deya Mota Kapor Matha-e Tuley Nerey Bhai" (treasure the coarse cloth spun in

your motherland), became an overnight sensation.

Rajanikanta wrote several books: "Bani" (1902), "Kalyani" (1905), "Sadbhabkusum" (1913) and "Sheshdan" (1916). "Bani" and "Kalyani" are collections of his songs. He became well known as 'Kantakobi."

Though Rajanikanta was influenced by Rabindranath Tagore, his songs have some unique characteristics. Most of them are inspired by his devotion. In addition, his love for his country forms another important theme of his songs.

The songs of Rajanikanta were inspired by the tunes and themes of Kirtan, Baul, Ramprasadi, Panchali. "Mishra Raga" (mixed raga) is predominant in Rajanikanta's compo-

Suchitra Sen hospitalised

Legendary Bengali film actress of yesteryears Suchitra Sen has been admitted to a Kolkata city nursing home with respiratory distress, but her condition is stated to be stable.

"Suchitra Sen, who was admitted with respiratory distress in the intensive therapy unit of Belle Vue Clinic due to chest infection, is responding to therapy and her condition is stable now," Belle Vue Clinic CEO Pradeep Tondon said quoting the medical bulletin on Thursday.

The 79-year-old actress was admitted on June 20. Sen could be released in a day or two as her health parameters has improved, Tondon said.

The reclusive silver screen diva, often compared with Greta Garbo, has not been seen in public since she quit the film world in the late 1970s. She was admitted twice to the same nursing home on February 27, 2008 and October 10, 2007.

Together with the late Bengali megastar Uttam Kumar, Sen formed the golden onscreen pair of Tollywood movies during the '50s to '70s period.

Theatre workshop on technical issues

A five-day theatre workshop on technical skill development begins today at Bangladesh Shilpakala Academy (BSA), Shegunbagicha, in Dhaka, according to a press release. Theatre Designers Institute, BSA and the Embassy of Switzerland in Bangladesh are jointly organising the workshop, which will take place at the National Theatre Hall, BSA.

Jan Lukas -- internationally renowned theatre activist and technical director of

popular Swiss troupe 'Mummenschanz' -- will conduct the workshop. Mummenschanz visited Dhaka last March and performed at the International Theatre Festival, organised by Dhaka Padatik.

Gabriele Derighetti, Charge d'affaires, Embassy of Switzerland and Sara Ara Mahmud, director, Department of Theatre and Film, BSA will be present at the opening session that will take place at equipments.

Wonder Woman is still a wonder

Wonder Woman has traded in her signature superhero briefs for skintight black pants. They are the centrepiece of a head-to-toe makeover that includes a navy motorcycle jacket and a pair of gold, bullet-deflecting gauntlets.

Why the change, and what does it mean, if anything?

First off, in her more modern comic-book costume. Wonder Woman (a.k.a. Diana Prince, a.k.a. Lynda Carter) looks like a glamorous athlete instead of an unusually muscular Miss America who happens to fight crime. The sleek lines of the new wonder pants evoke sci-fi warrior agility, while the cropped jacket -- with its studded epaulets -- adds rock star, Balmain flash.

Wonder Woman's look has not been substantially altered since 1941 (except for the late '60s and early '70s, when she gave up her costume entirely). The makeover purges the Americana from her clothes. She no longer looks as though she's wearing


