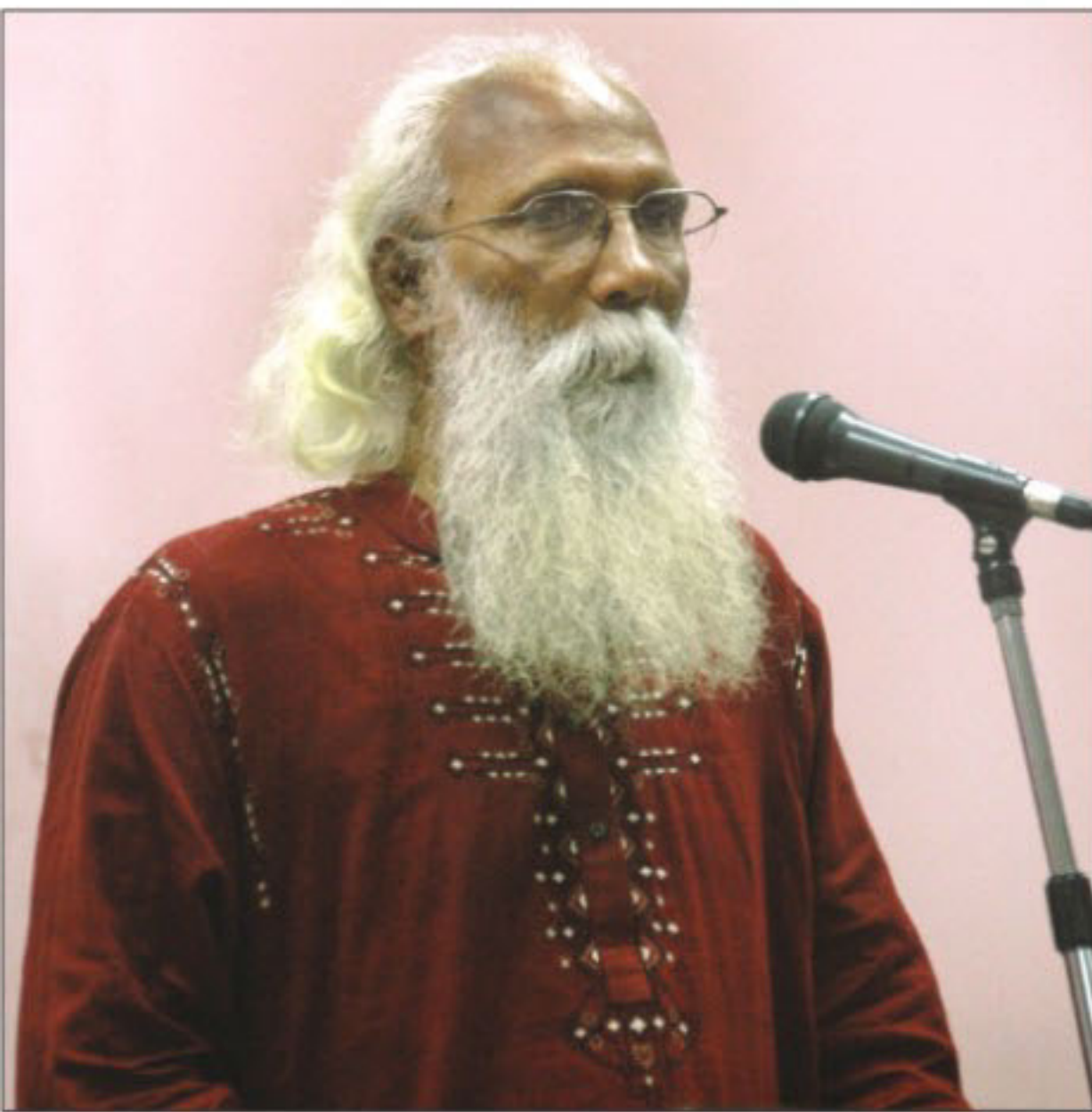

Ekattur-er Kobita: Recitation by poets at Public Library

Ekattur-er Jatri arranged a recitation programme, titled "Ekattur-er Kobita," at the Seminar Room of Central Public Library, Shahbagh on July 5. Both noted and emerging poets of the country recited their poems on the occasion.

Renowned poet Rafik Azad recited one of his poems, "Nebey Shadhinota," while Habibullah Sirajee recited "Priyo Shadhinota" at the event.

One of the leading poets of the country, Nirmolendu Goon, recited "Shuborno Golap-er Jonno," a poem on Bangabandhu's declaration of six-point charter.

Prior to reciting the poem, Goon

explained the title of the programme, "Ekattur-er Kobita." "Ekattur-er Kobita" should not only include poems written during the Liberation War. Poems written on the significant events leading to the war, memorable incidents during the war and following events that were caused by the war are also considered 'Ekattur-er Kobita.' Discussion and recitation by Jatra Proshikkhan Unnayan Gobeshona Parishad

To observe the 137th death anniversary of poet Michael Madhusudan Dutta, a programme featuring discussion and recitation were held on July 5 at the Central Public Library, Shahbagh. Jatra Proshikkhan Unnayan Gobeshona Parishad (JPUGP), an organisation for *jatra* artistes, arranged the programme.

Jatra artiste Banoshree Adhikari presented an essay, titled "Bangla Rangomanchey Michael," at the programme. The essay highlighted Madhusudan's works that have been adapted for stage by *jatra* artistes and theatre activists.

Professor Ishrafil Shahin of the Department of Theatre, Dhaka University; Professor Afsar Ahmed of the Department of Drama and Dramatics, Jahangirnagar University and theatre director Golam Sarwar discussed on the essay. Taposh Sarkar, president of JPUGP, presided over the discussion.

Michael's poems were recited after the discussion. Eminent *jatra* artiste Milon Kanti Dey recited excerpts from the epic "Meghnadh Badh Kabya." Dey's recitation without looking even for once at the written text amazed the audience. Later Professor Niranjan Adhikari discussed on the excerpts recited by Dey.

"Twilight" stars to be paid \$25 million for final films

The stars of "Twilight" Robert Pattinson, Kristen Stewart and Taylor Lautner are reportedly being paid a whopping \$25 million each for the final two movies in the vampire series.

Summit, the studio which produces the movie franchise, will pay the three leading stars an unprecedented 25 million each against 7.5 percent of the theatrical gross for starring in parts one and two of "Breaking Dawn," reported New York Daily News.

If "Breaking Dawn" earns as much as the second movie "New Moon," which raked in \$710 million, 7.5 percent of that would mean the stars could add another \$16 million to their salary for a total of \$41 million.

"A \$20 million pay day was typically reserved for A-list stars back in hey day of big salaries. This proves the point that [these days] the star doesn't make the box office, the box office makes the star," said box office guru Paul Dergarabedian.
