Azizul Islam was held at National Music and Dance Centre auditorium, Bangladesh Shilpakala Academy (BSA) on July 6. The programme was jointly organised by BSA and Sargam, a monthly magazine on music.

State minister for cultural affairs, Advocate Promode Mankin, was the chief guest, while secretary to the ministry of civil aviation and tourism, Shafik Al

Mehedi, was special guest at the event. Director of Music and Dance Department of BSA, RA Mahmud Selim, presided over the discussion. Editor of Sargam, Kazi Rawnak Hossain, delivered the welcome speech.

Shafik Al Mehedi admired the flutist's contribution to the music of Bangladesh throughout his four decade long career.

"If music could be played in every nook and corner of Bangladesh, peace would certainly prevail, and peace is the prerequisite to development. We have to face extremism with the weapon of melody," said Advocate Promode Mankin.

Prior to the discussion, the chief guest handed over a crest to Ustad Azizul Islam.

Ustad Captain (Rtd.) Azizul Islam is the only Bangladeshi instrumentalist to have taken part at the silver jubilee celebration of Dover Lane Music Conference -- the biggest Indian classical music event in Kolkata. Islam's love of the flute goes back to his early days when he was a navy captain. During moments of solitude, he often played the flute. The style of renowned flutist Panna Lal Ghosh inspired him at that time. Later, he learned to play banshi under Ustad Belayet Ali Khan, Ustad Bahadur Khan, Pt. Debendra Murdweshwar and VG Karnad.

At the event, Ustad Azizul Islam played "Raga Mian Ki Malhar" -- a monsoon raga created by Mian Tan Sen -accompanied by Syed Meher Hossain on tabla; M Mohon Sinha and M. Jahangir Alam on tanpura. The presentation lasted about 50 minutes. The presentation began in slow tempo; the artiste performed alaap, followed by flowering jor and jhala. Later, he performed gat on jhap taal, ek taal and teen taal based on the same raga.

Another presentation at the programme was an abridged form of "Raga Megh" on teen taal. The event wrapped up with the presentation of a dhun footed on "Raga Mishra Pilu" on dadra performed by Ustad Azizul Islam.

Dr. Niru Shamsunnahar anchored the programme.

Will spy ring story help Jolie's "Salt"?

Any movie marketer thinking that the forthcoming film about a female Russian sleeper spy might be helped by recent headlines should take those thoughts with a grain of "Salt."

The FBI's arrest of 11 alleged Russian spies recently does have unusual similarities with the Angelina Jolie film, which opens July 23. But being topical is no guarantee of success, says David A. Gross, a former studio marketing executive.

"I think that this intersection between entertainment and a specific current event -- I don't think that's necessarily a plus," says Gross, observing that recent Iraq warset films have foundered at the box office.

In film history, when art has been in close proximity to life, the result has been a mixed bag for movie marketers. The Arnold Schwarzenegger action film "Collateral Damage," which showed a terrorist attack on the U.S., was originally scheduled for release in October 2001 but was pushed back to February 2002 -- and had a trailer changed -- after the September 11, 2001, attacks. It still performed relatively poorly at the box office.

On the other hand, "Wag the Dog," the 1997 film about a political consultant who orders a war with Albania to distract the public from a presidential scandal, came out just weeks before revelations about the Bill Clinton-Monica Lewinsky imbroglio and had a successful run.

In fact, says Gross, who now runs the site Moviereviewintelligence.com, the studio's best strategy might be to stay out of the way.

"There might be a very small segment that thinks ['Salt'] is interesting because it's so timely and looks at the parallels of what's going on," he says. "But for the mass-appeal audience, they want to go see an intensely entertaining thriller with Angelina Jolie."

Other prescient films, which weren't timed quite so closely with current events, earned greater appreciation in retrospect: 1962's "The Manchurian Candidate," about a conspiracy planning an assassination attempt on a presidential candidate, gained notoriety a year later after the assassination of John F. Kennedy; 1976's "Network," a critical and box-office success when it was released, found its

extreme TV world looking positively quaint within a few years.

"Salt" features Jolie, Liev Schreiber and Chiwetel Ejiofor and is directed by Phillip Noyce, who has made a number of thrillers, including the box-office hits "Patriot Games" (1992) and "Clear and Present Danger" (1994) as well as the critical successes "Dead Calm" (1989) and "The Quiet American" (2002).

"Salt" might be the beginnings of a franchise, with Jolie a female equivalent to Jason Bourne or James Bond. But that depends on the film's success.

Bollywood film "Tere Bin Laden" ("Without You Laden"), the story of an imaginative young television journalist who turns an encounter with a look-alike of Laden into his ticket to fame. The journalist, played by Pakistani

pop artist Ali Zafar, films a video with the look-alike, which goes viral quickly, and attempts to use his 15 minutes of fame to migrate to the United States after past attempts at getting a visa failed. "The film looks to give a fresh per-

spective to the repercussions of 9/11 that a lot of people are facing but I want to do it through humour," director Abhishek Sharma said in an interview. "When he comes across a look-alike of bin Laden, he hits upon the idea of making a video. That video makes him famous and ironically, he has to use the U.S.'s biggest enemy to create a favour-

controversial personalities such as Indian outlaw Phoolan Devi and mafia don Dawood Ibrahim. But Sharma says the low-budget "Tere

Bin Laden," which opens across India on July 16, is not a serious film, and expects the audience to also treat it that way. "It's a satire, and a mad comedy. I

don't want to preach," said the director.
