Strauss taking Tigers lightly

England captain Andrew Strauss is adamant there is no danger of his side taking Bangladesh lightly in the first of three one-day internationals at Trent Bridge here on Thursday.

The Tigers have never beaten England in any match, across all formats.

England come into these matches on the back of 3-2 one-day series win over world champions Australia, having beaten Bangladesh convincingly in two Tests earlier in the English season.

Strauss, speaking to reporters at Trent Bridge here on Wednesday, said: "We've won four out of six one-dayers [this season] and we're very keen to win these three.

"They're a dangerous side, they all play shots, and Tamim Iqbal in particular is very dangerous.

"In Bangladesh [in March] we had to labour to win the one-day series and we're going to have to work hard and make sure we don't give them any inroads into the game.

"I don't think we're a good enough team just to turn up and win.

"We want to take things forward from our Australia win. There's no room for complacency on our part."

Mashrafe expects more

First ODI against England today

Bangladesh captain Mashrafe Bin Mortaza is confident his side will provide more of a challenge to England in their upcoming three onedayers than they did in last month's Test series.

The Tigers face England in the first one-day international at Trent Bridge here on Thursday having been well beaten 2-0 by their hosts in a Test series that ended with an innings and 80 run rout inside three days at Old Trafford.

Bangladesh then lost all three of their matches at the subsequent Asia Cup one-day tournament in Sri Lanka.

But some of the Tigers' best results in their decade of top-flight international cricket have come in the one-day game, notably when they beat world champions Australia at Cardiff in 2005.

However, they have never beaten England in any format and the hosts come into Thursday's match on the back of a 3-2 one-day series win over Australia.

Mashrafe, appointed captain for this series after Shakib Al Hasan was dumped from the post, told reporters at Trent Bridge here on Wednesday: "It isn't going to be easy against England. We have to play good cricket, hopefully we can do it and perform well this time.

"We are trying to play good cricket starting from the first match, that is our first ambition," the pace bowler added.

"England beat Australia in the first three matches so it is not going to be easy to win...we will concentrate on our own cricket, that is the

main thing.

"I think we are a better team in one-day cricket than in Test cricket and I think this game suits us," the 26-year-old pace bowler explained.

"A few of the batsman are in good form and hopefully a few other guys can join in."

England will be without injured star batsman Kevin Pietersen, who they were planning to rest in any event although a series against Bangladesh might have been the ideal chance for the South Africa born shotmaker to end a sequence of 16 ODI innings without a fifty.

But Mashrafe insisted Bangladesh took no comfort from Pietersen's absence.

"Playing against Pietersen is a great experience for us. When KP plays we feel we can learn so many things from him, so it's not good for us that he is injured."

Mashrafe was due to captain Bangladesh away to a weakened West Indies last year but was ruled out early on through a knee injury, with Shakib leading the side instead to victories in both Test and one-day campaigns.

"I am glad to be back," Mashrafe said. "Playing in England is always very exciting, there are a lot of Bangladeshis here who will hopefully come and support us."

Tamim Iqbal was the standout Bangladesh performer in the Test series, with the lefthanded opener scoring centuries at both Lord's and Old Trafford,

"Tamim is definitely the guy who can change the game for us," Mashrafe said, "We are looking for him [to perform] but not just him: Shakib Al Hasan, Mushfiqur, Jahurul Islam too. There are a few guys who can do good things and hopefully they will."

An Argentine lawmaker on Wednesday suggested erecting a statue to football coach Diego Maradona in the capital Buenos Aires as he sponsored a bill to honour one of the country's most famous sons.

Maradona, who will be 50 later this year, still has great public cachet in his homeland despite Argentina crashing out of the World Cup in the quarterfinals to Germany, who beat his side 4-0.

But lower house member Juan Cabandie, an ally of President Cristina Kirchner, said he would back a bill for a statue because "the Argentine people have shown that, where Maradona is

concerned, results are not important." "Maradona has become an icon of Argentine popular culture, he is a social phenomenon and his popularity goes beyond the

sporting arena." Cabandie said a monument would highlight Maradona's strength of character and loyalty to his country's cause as "he continues to write chapters

of a story which seems to be without end." Maradona already has a three-metre-high statue to him weighing some 300 kilos at the Boca Juniors Bombonera stadium where he

first made his name. Despite the loss to Germany Maradona's

men received a warm welcome home after impressing up to that stage -- having endured a very mixed qualifying campaign.

Although he is said to be very down over the defeat and has been keeping a low profile in his Buenos Aires home he may yet stay in the post he took in late 2008.

Some observers believe he may be unable to resist leading the country to a home triumph next year in the Copa America.

Earlier, the Argentine Football Association said it had not been in touch as yet with Maradona over his future having indicated it will let him make a decision.

Maradona remains an idol in Argentina having propelled them to the 1986 World Cup with a series of electrifying performances and he also played in the team which came run-

ners-up to Germany in 1990. Four years later he was banned after testing positive for performance-enhancing drugs.

As Argentina coach he struggled to qualify the team for the World Cup, suffered a string of losses including a 6-1 hiding in Bolivia.

Yet their early World Cup finals campaign was strong with three group stage wins over Nigeria, South Korea and Greece followed by a win over Mexico before the Germans swamped them.

Bayern Munich need to further strengthen their team if they want to challenge for the Champions League title, their Dutch star winger Arjen Robben said.

Brilliant goals define Dutch win

As far as semifinals go the Netherlands and Uruguay served up a somewhat tepid affair that was lit up by a few moments of absolute brilliance. Goals from their two stars Wesley Sneijder and Arjen Robben and an absolute scorcher from Gio van Bronckhorst meant that the Dutch advanced to their first final in 32 years. Uruguay went home after a sterling tournament and a somewhat easy run



to the semis, but they will have done their chances of future success no harm with their performance here. More importantly, it means that the World Cup will definitely stay in Europe and it will also mark the first time that a European side will lift the World Cup in a continent other than their own.

Tuesday was an evenly matched game, with both Uruguay and the Netherlands threatening to seize on the probable. Both sides threatened to cancel each other out,

until Gio van Bronckhorst produced an uncharacteristic moment of absolute brilliance.

Van Bronckhorst's 35-yard drive from the right-hand side of the box arrowed into the top corner leaving Muslera no chance. It was a richly deserved reward for a veteran who is probably playing his last tournament.

But the tragic hero of this World Cup is Diego Forlan. The Atletico Madrid striker has been nothing short of inspirational for his side and he yet again proved the catalyst for an unlikely reply; his left foot rocket misread by Maarten Steklenburg.

The Dutch however made a tactical tweak bringing on Van der Vaart for de Zeeuw. With more attack-minded players on the pitch, the game swung in favour of the Europeans and it was little surprise when Sneijder of all people, Muslera's dive.
