Bangladesh Rifles (BDR) and Indian Border Security Force (BSF) yesterday agreed to contain cross border crimes and other related issues through talks.

Border guards of two neighbouring countries reached at an agreement at a battalion commander level meeting held at Taki Camp in India yesterday.

Matters relating to killing and kidnapping innocent Bangladeshi nationals, smuggling of arms, explosives and drugs, cross border trafficking of women and children, insurgency, other criminal activities and confidence building measures came up during discussion.

During meeting, BDR alleged that BSF men kill Bangladeshi cattle traders along border areas off and on instead of arrest.

However, BSF officials showed positive attitude in resolving disputes through talks by holding flag meeting, a BDR official said.

Officials of both the border guards of Bangladesh and India agreed to resolve major disputes through discussion and by taking necessary measures on time.

Commanding Officer Lt Col Iqbal Azim of BDR 41 Rifles Battalion at Satkhira and BSF 18 Battalion Commanding Officer Ananta Singh led their respective teams.

Police foil human chain programme of rice traders

Police on Wednesday foiled a human chain programme formed by rice traders and truck workers in Dupchachia upazila town demanding their security as well as rice-laden trucks.

Four people were also injured as police charged batons on the traders and workers and snatched the banners while foiling the programme, said the president of Dupchachia Rice Mill Owners' Association, Mobarak Ali.

The injured are Mobarak, Abdul Majid, Faizul Islam and Rana, he said adding, most often truck workers are injured and killed by crimi-

The human chain was formed from CO office bus stand to forest office.

However, being chased by traders and workers the law enforcers left the spot.

In an instant reaction, the workers and traders blocked the Bogra-Naogaon road for two hours. But after sometime they withdrew their programme when police admitted their fault.

Contacted, the officer-incharge (OC) of Dupchachia police station, Mozammel Haque, said police mistakenly took action thinking BNP-Jamaat as organizers of the human chain.

500 vehicles get stuck at Paturia, Daulatdia

BCL men ransack IU bldg

Villagers block highway 'protesting' arrest of 4 students after vandalism; 20 hurt in clash with police

Twenty people including five police personnel were injured in a clash between law enforcers and villagers as people of Modhupur village adjacent to the campus of Islami University (IU) in Kushtia put barricade on Kushtia-Jhenidah highway yesterday evening.

The villagers put the barricade protesting arrest of IU student Mahbubur Rahman, also a resident of the village, and four others in connection with the ransacking on the campus yesterday morning.

Police arrested 20 people after the evening incident.

A group of Bangladesh Chhatra League (BCL) activists ransacked four office rooms of the administrative building of IU and fired 10 to 12 blank shots on the campus yesterday morning. The incident occurred as a

seguel to feud between two groups of BCL activists who got locked into several clashes on the campus after announcement of the IU unit committee of the organisation on May 28 last, campus sources said.

Some 30 BCL activists, led by former president of the university unit of the organisation Shahnoor Alam Keramat and present joint secretary Mahbubur Rahman, went out of Bangabandhu Hall at about 10:00am yesterday and ransacked rooms in the administrative building, said police and campus sources.

The BCL men threatened two university officials of dire

consequences as the latter tried to prevent them from ransacking valuables, campus sources said.

On information, Islami University Police Station Officer-in-Charge Mizanur Rahman reached the spot with a police team.

IU students Zillur Rahman, Mahbubur Rahman, Abu Jar Giffary Al Gaffar and Liton and an outsider were arrested at Bangabandhu Hall as police led by Kushtia Superintendent of Police Sahabuddin Khan launched a drive on the campus at about 2:30pm.

Protesting the arrest, people of Modhupur village, the home of Mahbubur Rahman, put barricade on Kushtia-Jhenidah highway near the IU campus at

around 7:00pm yesterday. When police tried to

remove the barricade, the villagers got locked into a clash with the law enforcers, causing injuries to five police personnel and 15 villagers. "The troublemakers have

been filed with the local police station in this connection," said IU Proctor Mahbubul Arefin. Vice Chancellor Prof Mohammad Alauddin said stern action will be taken against those who created

also take action after discussion with our central leaders," BCL university unit secretary Shamsuzzaman Tuhin told this correspondent over phone.

Jahangir Hossain was made president and Shamsuzzaman Tuhin secretary of the university unit of BCL committee that was announced on May 28 this year but a group led by Mahbubur Rahman and Ali Mortuza Khosru, aspirants for president and secretary posts of the committee, rejected the committee, campus sources said.

As the two groups clashed on the campus over the issue on June 2, 4 and 6, the authorities closed the university for eight days.

The university reopened on June 15.

Nearly half of over 400 students of Goarha High School in Ghatbhog union under Rupsha upazila of Khulna district have to wade through waist-deep muddy water of Atharobeki River to attend their classes.

Over a hundred of them have already stopped attending classes to avoid the risky act as Atharobeki River, which is gradually drying up under adverse impact of climate change, became unfit for movement of boats or mechanised ferries over two months

"Around 200 students, who are inhabitants of Anandanagar, Kharhbaria and Sheikhpura villages in neighbouring Terokhada upazila, have to take the trouble to wade through muddy water of the river for attending their classes. Many students recently caught cold as they got soaked with muddy water," said Headmaster

Anadi Ranjan Biswas. "My parents have asked me not to go to school as boat service across the dried up

160 arrested in Rangpur

Kotwali police yesterday arrested 160 people from Gangachara upazila in connection with leakage of question meant for today's interview for selection of candidates for the posts of assistant teachers of government high schools.

Police arrested all the160 from a guesthouse at Vinno Jagot, a private park at Gonjipur under the upazila.

Police also arrested four people hailing from Rangpur, Nilphamari and Kushtia districts including a clerk of the establishment ministry for their alleged involvement in supplying the question papers to the candidates.

The arrestees are Hamidul Islam of Bheramara, Kustia, Azizul Haque and Sirajul Islam of Kellabond, Aminul Islam of Mulatol under Rangpur Sadar upazila and Aminul Islam, a clerk of the establishment ministry.

A number of staff of the establishment ministry and BG Press leaked out the question papers to the interviewers, police said.

They asked all the160 hailing from different districts to come to the guesthouse on Wednesday. Accordingly, they came and got the question papers. The candidates were asked to memorise answers to 80 questions in two days. The candidates were supposed to depart the guesthouse yesterday night.

On a tip-off, police raided the guesthouse and arrested them. Police also seized the question papers and a photo-

Being quizzed, the arrested candidates told police that they had a contract of Tk5 lakh with the question suppliers. They said to have paid Tk 2 lakh in advance while they were supposed to pay the rest amount after the interview.

Arms, bombs recovered in 2 dists: 14 held

Members of Rapid Action Battalion (Rab) recovered arms and ammunition including bombs in separate drives conducted in Chuadanga and Kushtia yesterday morning and Wednesday.

Under-trial prisoner dies

A Chuadanga court sent him to jail after police produced him in court on April 29. The case against Abur is under investigation, OC said.

Tiger kills one in Sundarbans

Contacted, Kadamtala Forest Officer Masud Alam confirmed the incident. Locals recovered the body from the deep forest at about 3:00pm.

Cargo vessel sinks

A limestone-laden cargo vessel capsized in Banstali channel of the Kumarkhali River after it collided with an oil tanker near Rampal yesterday morning. It sank when a Chittagong-bound oil tanker MT Energy-2 collided head on with it at 8:00am.
