Pumpkin farming in barren lands changes their lot

Fortune smiled on the farmers as the district saw a bumper production of pumpkin this season. Pumpkin traders are also happy as

they are making good profit by selling the vegetable. They are sending it to different districts including Jessore and Khulna.

Thakurgaon pumpkin has already drawn attention of traders and consumers of several districts, local traders said. Cultivation of pumpkin gained popu-

larity in the district in recent years as it significantly contributed to alleviation of poverty in some villages.

Farmers have opted for high lands that were considered barren only 9-10 years ago. The growers of those areas, besides Farabari, Yakubpur, Dholerhat and Chameshshory villages, under Sadar upazila have become solvent by cultivat-

ing pumpkin for the last several years. The cultivation process of pumpkin is easy and the production cost is also less

than any other vegetables.

Sources said, about 1,155 tonnes of

pumpkin have been produced by cultivating about 135 acres of land in the district this season while each maund is being sold at Tk 180-200 in the wholesale market.

Biswanath Barman, 35, a farmer of Yakubpur village, cultivated pumpkin on 14 bighas (one bigha is equal to .3306 acre) of land producing about 1400 maunds of pumpkin.

"At the beginning of the season I sold each mound of pumpkin at Tk 200-Tk 220 and later at Tk 170", he said.

As Biswanath planted pumpkin after potato cultivation his production cost was only Tk 3000 per bigha because a very low quantity of fertiliser is needed for pumpkin field after potato cultivation.

Biswanath said he made a profit of about Tk 2 lakh this season spending only Tk 43,000 to prepare his land.

Bhabesh Chandra, a schoolteacher of Koshalbari High School and also a midlevel farmer under Sadar upazila, told this correspondent that he cultivated pumpkin on a 3-bigha land and produced 240 maunds of pumpkin.

"I spent only Tk 9,000 but sold the produces at Tk 45,000", he said.

Cultivation of pumpkin is easy and needs little care as the pest attack is lesser than any other vegetables, Bhabesh said, adding the harvesting cost is also cheaper compared to other crops.

Rafiqul Islam, a vegetable trader at Kalukhatra village told this correspondent that he has been sending pumpkins to Jessore and Khulna by covered vans for the last two months. Each van contained about 400 maund of pumpkin bringing a profit of about Tk 10,000-Tk 12,000, he said.

"I have already earned Tk 1,80,000 by selling pumpkin in the current season, said Rafigul

According to Dalil Uddin, Deputy Director of Department of Agriculture Extension (DAE), Thakurgaon, sandyloamy soil is ideal for pumpkin cultiva-

Mainly hybrid verities like sweety, suprima are being cultivated in the areas. Indigenous varieties are also quite popular, he said.

Farmers have become interested in pumpkin cultivation as they are getting good return with low production and labour cost, he explained.

Youth held with arms

Fake fertiliser seized

Police in Bagmara upazila on Friday evening seized 537 sacks of adulterated fertiliser from a warehouse of local dealer Abdus Salam in Taherpur of municipality area. Police also arrested three people including an employee of the upazila office of Department of Agriculture Extension, Ataur Rahman. Two others are labourers Abdul Hakim Mondol of Durgapur and Rabiul Islam of Puthia. The seized goods include 198 sacks of adulterated MOP, 72 sacks of TSP and 291 sacks of MP fertiliser.

Fish farm worker killed

A fish farm worker was killed in an attack allegedly by the firm owner and his two labourers in Singua Chakpara area of Nokla upazila on Friday. The deceased was identified as Hatem Ali, 40, son of late Moin Uddin, hailed from Barmaisha village in the same upazila. Police and locals said Moazzem Hossain Liton, owner of the farm, picked up a quarrel with his worker Hatem Ali over a trifling matter. At one stage, Liton with the help of his two other labourers, Hashem Quader and Ramizuddin, hit Hatem with a sharp weapon at about 12:00 noon, leaving him critically injured. Later, the victim died on way to Nokla hospital. Hatem's wife filed a case in this connection. Police arrested Hashem Quader in connection with the murder.

Poultry owners burn chicks

Poultry farm owners burnt 2,000 broiler chicks at North Temohony of the town yesterday protesting the high price of one-day old chicks. Witnesses said a poultry trader, purchasing those chicks from Usha Poultry and Hatchery of Dhaka, was going to Bhola through Laxmipur. On information, agitated poultry farm owners seized the chicks and set those on fire. The government fixed the price of one-day old broiler chicks at Tk 30 per piece and layer chicks at Tk 32 per piece but the hatchery owners are selling those chicks at the rate of Tk 70-75 per piece ignoring government's directive. National Committee of Poultry Farm Owners has been agitating for the last one week against the high price of chicks and poultry farm owners and also stopped purchasing chicks.

Trade fair in Sylhet finally from July 14

The much talked about international trade fair organised by Sylhet Chamber of Commerce and Industries (SCCI), is finally going to start from 14 July.

SCCI administrator Faruque Mahmud Chowdhury announced this at a press conference yesterday afternoon at Sylhet Press Club.

The business body had to look for alternative venues several times to hold 'Sylhet International Trade Fair 2010' due to protest from different quarters for the last 5 months.

Finally, the committee selected the open space belonging to the Sylhet Infectious Disease Hospital in Shahi Eidgah area. In his written statement at

the press conference, Faruque Chowdhury said the 12th international trade fair would be formally inaugurated by the Commerce Minister Faruque Khan. Besides reputed

Bangladeshi ones, business firms and companies from observed a half-day strike in India, Pakistan, China, Thailand, Iran and Malaysia are expected to take part in it.

He said that the organisers this time leased out the event management through open tender at Tk 81,50,500. Adequate security arrangements have been made to hold the fair, he added.

Earlier the locals handed over a memo to the Deputy Commissioner recently to stop the fair on the plea of deterioration of the law and order since the site is close to a tea garden

and also a crime zone. The SCCI in line with the Ministry of Commerce calendar had decided to hold the fair in March. The trade body at first selected the Government MC College playground, but later shifted it to the Uposhahar playground. Again the guardians of the area objected to the move compelling the SCCI to shift the venue to the Government Aliya Madrasa Maidan. But, that also had to be cancelled in face of protest by the businessmen and students.

The businessmen under the banner of Sylhet Zila Bayboshayee Oikya O Kalyan Parishad took to the street and addition to human chain, sit-in and procession apprehending fall in their normal business.

It may be difficult to believe, but Samsul Haque, 60, a landless farmer of Purbapara at Sultanpur village under Sadar upazila of the district has earned Tk 1,70,000.00 by cultivating pumpkin this season.

Brahmanbaria Agriculture Extension Department (AED) recently honoured him as one of the best cultivators in the district.

This season, Samsul Haque along with his two sons -- Jahangir Hossain, 25, and Alamgir Hossain, 22, --leased 2.70 acres of cultivable high land at Bangaj village under Darkhar union of Akhaura upazila.

In the Bangla month of Kartik (from October 16 last year), Samsul started cultivating the vegetable with an investment target of Tk 40,000.00. He started harvesting after about six months in the Bangla month of Baishakh and finished the sale of produce last month. He sold pumpkin worth Tk, 1,70,000.00 with a net profit of Tk 1,30,000.00.

seeds which he stored every year. He has grown 7,000 pieces of pumpkin in his land, each weighing from 5 kg to 40 kg. About the process of cultivation, Samsul said he at first made the land fit by tilling after weeding out the grass. Then he made hundreds of 3.38 cubic feet size holes in the land leaving a gap of two feet. Each hole was filled with a certain quantity of mixture of ashes, cow dung, water hyacinth, compost manure and 200 gm of chemical fertiliser. After 10 days he planted seed in every heap of mixture in the land.

Following his huge success Shamsul put on display a few big pumpkins weighing 35 kg to 40 kg at a stall of recently held agriculture fair, arranged by Brahmanbaria Agriculture Extension Department.

Contacted, Samsul Haque said, he owns no land but he grows different crops after leasing field from the land owners.

He has also a nursery garden, he added.

BSF kills one in Dinajpur

Body of another yet to be returned at Jaintapur

Indian Border Security Force of cultivation for achieving the bumper (BSF) yesterday killed a Bangladeshi in Dinajpur while they are yet return the body of another man shot dead by Indian Khasias at Jaintapur in Sylhet.

> A cattle trader was shot dead by BSF along Birampur frontier in Dinajpur early yesterday.

The victim was identified as Okimuddin, 18, son of Kefatullah of Chalksulban village of the upazila.

BDR sources said BSF troops of Bhimpur Patla camp opened fire on Okim near border pillar 291/13 at about 5:00am when he went there to bring cow, leaving him dead on the spot.

The BSF members also took away the body.

In Jaintapur, Sylhet, the BSF is yet to return the body of Bangladeshi who was shot dead by the Indian Khasias Thursday afternoon on the Lalakhal borders.

Tension mounted again on the day after the Indian Khasias intruded and picked up a Bangladeshi national from Lalakhal and shot him dead.
