"People who cheered in joy seeing the lifeless bodies of the officers, and tried to destroy evidence by burying the bodies in mass graves, do they deserve forgiveness?" the prosecutor questioned, and pleaded the court not to let the accused go unpunished.

The Special Court 6 is only empowered to try charges of mutiny against the 735 jawans of the Sadar and attached rifle battalions, who are indicted for mutiny.

Trial for criminal offences like killing, arson, hiding of bodies, and looting will be held at a civilian criminal court; and the Criminal Investigation Department, tasked with investigating the mutiny, is likely to press criminal charges today against 824 people, mostly BDR

awans. The three-member special court headed by the border security force's Director General Maj Gen Md Rafigul Islam began at 10:30am in Darbar Hall of the headquarters, and continued till 1:00pm.

After the court sat, plaintiff of the case, Subeder Munshi Jahangir Alam, read out the

charges against the 735.

The court took the charges into cognisance, directed the authorities to show all accused arrested in the case, and to produce them before the court at 10:00am today.

Among the accused, 298 have been in different jails, as they were arrested in the criminal case filed following the February 25-26 bloody mutiny in 2009 that left 74 people including 57 army officers killed. The other 437 are still serving at different units.

The other members of the court are Lt Col Md Nurul Alam, and Maj Gen Ali Mushtain Khan. Additional Attorney General Kazi Izarul Haque Akand assisted the court.

The charges against the accused include leaving Darbar Hall defying the order of the then BDR director general in a pre-planned manner despite being members of a disciplined force; not carrying out duties vested upon the accused; taking part in the mutiny; assisting other mutineers in killing, arson, and looting of firearms; not refraining the offenders from committing the crimes; not playing any role to save the murdered officers and their

family members.

said more politicians are engaged in extortion than are journalists. Even the profession of some of them is extortion, he said adding, "We should not throw stones from a glass house."

Mrinal Kanti Das, AL deputy office secretary, said they are shocked at his remarks.

Latif Siddiqui just cannot call the grassroots AL men "petty thieves". He must not forget it was them who have sacrificed most for the organisation.

Mrinal added that the issue would be raised at the next ALCWC meeting, where they would request the party president for stern action against Siddiqui.

A number of ruling party lawmakers yesterday discussed the issue among themselves in and outside parliament and condemned Siddiqui's remarks.

"I think he is crazy. The prime minister should take drastic action against him before he harms the government and the party more," a lawmaker told The Daily Star in return for anonymity.

Another lawmaker said the jute minister has disgraced the party and the government. "What a shame! Nothing

can be more depressing than his comments. He has become harmful to both the government and the organisation," said the AL MP preferring not to be named.

Meanwhile, Rafique-ul Huq yesterday protested Siddiqui's remarks about him. He said he would file a defamation case against the minister if he does not retract his comments. "Abdul Latif Siddiqui has

told lies about me. I will defi-

nitely sue him for defamation

if he does not apologise and

withdraw the words," he told The Daily Star. He said Siddiqui called him yesterday and said he did not make such comments. When Huq referred to TV reports, the minister said he would take

back what he has said. The veteran lawyer said he does not get it why Siddiqui had to make such comments.
