Dhaka seeks end to Libyan visa forgery

Bangladesh is set to propose the Libyan embassy in Dhaka to send the visa information of Libya-bound Bangladeshi workers to the immigration at Hazrat Shahjalal (R) International Airport to check visa forgery.

"We will propose setting up a mechanism so that the Libyan embassy in Dhaka can forward the visa numbers of Bangladeshi workers online. This information will be provided to manpower bureau and the immigration at the airport," said Nurul Islam, director of the Bureau of Manpower Employment and Training (BMET).

A Libyan delegation comprised of officials from Bangladesh end as the cause of it. from technical education and immigration is expected to visit Bangladesh July 14.

Early this year, Expatriates' Welfare and Overseas Employment Minister Khandker Mosharraf Hossain led a delegation to Libya

where both the countries agreed to work together to improve the labour migration management.

This visit of the Libyan delegation is a followup meeting where the strategies to check visa forgery are likely to top the agenda. BMET has

already prepared a concept paper for the meeting. Libya is an emerging labour market requiring around one million workers by 2014 for its booming construction sector. The oil-rich country, home to some 90,000 Bangladeshis, had been hiring on average over 2,000 workers per month from January 2008 till this April, which drastically halved in May-June.

Officials concerned identified visa forgery

This year, Libya has deported 39 questioned about the connec-Bangladeshi workers while 88 in late last year. Some of them entered the country with fake visas while others without work permits.

Maola, Nizami, Mojahid quizzed together



Sylhet BCL man killed by rivals

Rivals killed an activist of Bangladesh Chhatra League (BCL) in Shaplabag area of the city yesterday afternoon.

The deceased was Udayendu Singha Polash, a student of 3rd year honours of mathematics department in Sylhet MC

College. Police said Polash was heading for his mess by a motorcycle. When his bike reached Shaplabag first lane area around 2:00pm, some eight to nine young men attacked him and stabbed severely.

The attackers escaped the scene after the incident. Polash was rushed to Sylhet MAG Osmani Medical College Hospital where doctors declared him dead.

Earlier around 12:30pm yesterday, BCL factions were locked in chase and counter chase on the MC College campus, said the locals. SEE PAGE 15 COL 7

Uganda blasts kill 70 at World Cup parties

Suspected Somali Islamists carried out two bomb attacks in the Ugandan capital that killed 70 people watching the World Cup final at a restaurant and a sports club, authorities said vesterday.

Suspicion fell on the al Shabaab rebel group, which claims links with al Qaeda, after the severed head of a suspected Somali suicide bomber was found at one of the blast sites.

The explosions ripped through two bars packed with soccer fans watching the final moments of World Cup final in an Ethiopianthemed restaurant and at a gathering in a Kampala rugby club on Sunday. AFP reports, Shabaab rebels claimed respon-

sibility yesterday for Kampala bombings. "We are behind the attack because we are at

war with them," Ali Mohamoud Rage, the Shabaab group's top spokesman told reporters in Mogadishu.

The movement's top leader had warned in an audio message earlier this month that Uganda would face retaliation for contributing to an African Union force supporting the western-backed Somali transitional government.

Al Shabaab militants in Somalia have threatened to attack Uganda for sending peacekeeping
