Zapatero said during a reception for the Spanish squad at his official residence. "There is no better role model for our youths, given his talent and personal qualities. Thank you Iniesta for remembering Dani

yesterday during an unforgettable day for Spain." Zapatero was referring there to the incident immediately after

Iniesta scored his extra-time goal, when the 26-year-old took off his blue Spain jersey to reveal a white T-shirt bearing the message: "Dani Jarque: always with us".

Jarque collapsed and died at the age of 26 in August 2009 following a training session in Coverciano, Italy while his Espanyol squad were on a preseason camp just one month after being named captain of the team.

Iniesta, who was Jarque's teammate on Spain's under-17, under-19, under-20 and under-21 teams, was given a yellow card for removing his jersey during the match.

He gave the prime minister a red Spanish team jersey which was signed by the entire squad.

"Yes, I know he did not score the goal," he joked just before giving Zapatero the jersey.

"I want to talk for a bit. Thank you for the welcome, I am very proud to be a part of this team and this little trophy is for everyone," he added.

The German football federation DFB issued a lukewarm apology for the World Cup team's exit through the back door on its return the previous FIFA day in what is becoming a PR disaster.

In a letter posted on the national team website (team.dfb.de) and signed simply dfb, and quoting neither a player nor an official, the authors say "the team (team.dfb.de) apologizes to those who came (to Frankfurt) in vain. "The team doesn't want to alienate its

devoted fans."

Several hundred fans had come to Frankfurt airport early Monday to welcome the team of coach Joachim Loew and captain Philipp Lahm which had thrilled in South Africa with attractive football and finished third. However, they never got to see their idols as

the players left through the back door for their homes or holiday destinations. This upset many fans after the whole coun-

try had rallied behind the team in a similar frenzy as in the 2006 home edition.

The DFB insisted in the letter that a celebration at the airport had never been planned

because the team did not deem it appropriate to be hailed for a third-place finish. "This team wants more, for itself and the

fans," said the letter. The airport PR flop came after the team also refused a celebratory reception at the Berlin

Mohammedan Sporting Club completed their first-leg campaign of the Green Delta Insurance Premier Division Hockey League with an all-win record as the title contenders thumped archrivals Abahani 3-0 in their last match at the Maulana Bhasani Hockey Stadium yesterday.

Pakistani forward Mohammad Sabbir gave Mohammedan the lead just before the break while local strikers Jahidul Islam Rajon and Rasel Mahmud Jimmy scored one goal each in the second half to help the Black and Whites top the table with nine straight victories that lifted their point tally to 27 points, three ahead of last year's runners-up Abahani, who tasted their first defeat in nine matches.

Mohammedan, who had to be content finishing behind champions Usha KC and Abahani last season, will start the Super League campaign taking on Ajax SC on Thursday in a bid to regain the title.

Abahani were boosted by five former Pakistani national players, including penalty corner specialist Sohail Abbas, and they began at great pace to press Mohammedan from the outset. They should have taken an early lead but the young striker Hasan Jubair Niloy failed to connect a fierce hit from Pakistani Mohammad Javed.

That was in fact the lone field goal chance for Abahani in the whole game. Though they

picked up four penalty corners, Sohail Abbas failed to convert any of them in the face of good defence from Mohammedan.

Mohammedan gradually grew in confi-

dence to control the midfield and attacked through the wings and found the goal three Jimmy sent the ball to Musa Mia inside the danger zone and the veteran forward pushed it to an unmarked Sabbir, who tapped the ball

home from handshaking distance to give Mohammedan a deserved lead one minute from the break. After resumption, Abahani stepped up the attack to equalise the margin, but they could
