Shamsher Mobin's bail petition rejected

A Dhaka court yesterday rejected a bail petition of BNP Vice-Chairman Shamsher Mobin Chowdhury in connection with a case filed for torching a private car the night before June 27 hartal that killed a man.

Judge (In charge) of the Metropolitan Sessions Judge's Court passed the order after defence lawyers submitted a bail petition against the rejection order of the lower court on July 4.

The BNP leader was shown arrested in the murder case soon after another Dhaka court on June 30 granted him bail in the case filed with Gulshan police station for assaulting the police.

The driver, Faruque Hossain suffered burns on 60 percent of his body as criminals torched his car on June 26 and died at the Burn and Plastic Surgery Unit of Dhaka Medical College Hospital (DMCH) on July 1.

Shamsher Mobin, arrested on the day of hartal, was taken on a day's remand on June 28 on charges of obstructing police from discharging their duties and vandalising vehicles during the strike called by the opposition BNP.

Jamaat Ameer Motiur Rahman Nizami, its Secretary General Ali Ahsan Mohammad Mojahid, Nayebe Ameer Delwar Hossain Sayedee, BNP leader Mirza Abbas were also shown arrested in the case.

DUNCAN CALLS ON HASINA

PM for quick release of climate funds

Seeks British cooperation in exploration of gas, coal and oil

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina yesterday reiterated her call to the developed nations specially Britain for quick release of climate change adaptation fund, committed in the last Copenhagen summit, for the most vulnerable countries like Bangladesh.

The premier made the call while visiting British Minister for State for International Development Alan Duncan MP paid a courtesy call on her at her official residence Gano Bhaban yesterday morning.

After the call-on PM's Press Secretary Abul Kalam Azad said the premier thanked British government for their assistance in poverty alleviation, education, health, sanitation and emergency aid in natural disasters.

Briefing newsmen after the meeting, the press secretary said Hasina also sought British cooperation in exploration of gas, coal and oil in Bangladesh.

The PM requested the British minister to continue current student friendly visa policy and withdraw temporary suspension on issuing visa to Bangladeshi students.

During the call-on, the PM also requested the British government for regular intake of Bangladeshi workers for the restaurants in the UK and easing the process for them to obtain visa for work.

She informed the British state minister that her government after assuming office with landslide victory in the last general election has started working to strengthen parliamentary democracy in the country.

In this context, she mentioned the for-

mation of all the parliamentary standing committees in the first session of the current parliament when seven posts of chairman were given to opposition political parties to this end.

She said like British Parliament her government introduced prime minister's question hours in the Jatiya Sangsad.

Laying emphasis on uninterrupted democracy for over all development of a country, Hasina said no country can achieve development without democracy.

In this context, she said her government is working relentlessly to strengthen parliamentary democracy in the country.

The PM said Bangladesh has harvested a bumper food production and been able to achieve food security as a result of some pragmatic steps taken by her government including drastic cut down of fertiliser prices.

Hasina said her government achieved around six percent growth rate during last fiscal despite world economic recession. Referring to women empowerment,

Hasina said the government is working to empower women at all levels for ensuring balanced development.

In reply, the British minister appreciated the prime minister for her prudent leadership in different international forums on climate change issue and keeping the country's economic wheel moving even during the worldwide economic recession.

Principal Secretary to the PM M A Karim, Ambassador At-Large M Ziauddin and Secretary to the PM's Office Mollah Waheeduzzaman, among others, were present on the occasion.
