GPA-5 galore in HSC

Average pass percentage 71.82; 25,512 secure GPA-5

The results of Higher Secondary Certificate (HSC) and equivalent examinations 2010 show a significant rise in the number of students passed and GPA-5 achievers.

The percentage of students passed this year's HSC exams under eight education boards stands at 71.82 with 25,512 GPA-5 (Grade Point Average) scorers. The pass percentage increased by 1.39 points while GPA-5 achievers 7,290 than that of the last

A total of 5,33,369 students-- 2,88,546 male and 2,44,823 female--passed in this year's HSC and equivalent exams out of 7,18,084 examinees-- 3,86,671 male and 3,31,413 female.

As many as 145 students under Dhaka board sat for the exams in five centres SEE PAGE 15 COL 1

SC upholds EC's decision to cancel his candidacy for 'graft conviction' in 2008

The Supreme Court yesterday upheld the High Court order declaring legal the Election Commission's decision to cancel Awami League lawmaker Mohiuddin Khan Alamgir's candidature in the 2008 parliamentary election.

The full-bench Appellate Division headed by Chief Justice Mohammad Fazlul Karim passed the judgment after dismissing the ruling party MP's leave-to-appeal petition against the HC order.

The commission cancelled the candidature on grounds that Alamgir was convicted and sentenced to 13 years in prison in a graft case.

The apex court's decision comes 11 days after it quashed the

ALleader's conviction. The rationale behind vester-

day's SC order is that Alamgir had a conviction at the time the returning officer was

Factors behind good results

Competitive attitude of students, them being conscious of matters related to studies, better care by guardians and teachers, and copy-free exams contributed to better results in this year's HSC exams, educationists observed.

Even though the number of colleges with cent percent pass rate dropped, the number of institutions with zero percent pass rate has come down significantly this year in all education boards indicating quite a qualitative change.

The combined pass percentage rose to 74.28 from last year's 72.78. The pass percentage was 76.19 in 2008, 65.60 in 2007 and 63.92 in 2006.

Only 21 colleges achieved cent percent pass rate in 2002 but now the number increased to 714. The number of colleges having zero percent pass rate was 86 in 2006, now it is down to 25.


