Sagar unbeaten champ

FM Minhazuddin Ahmed Sagar emerged unbeaten champion in the Mercantile Bank 36th National Championship after drawing against Debaraj Chatterjee in the final round at the Bangladesh Chess Federation hall-room yesterday.

The draw meant Sagar kept his solo lead to finish with 10 points from 12 games. It is the first national championship title for Sagar, who was junior champion for three years from 2007 to 2009. He qualified for the national champions in 2008 and continued to participate in both the junior and national championships.

FM Abu Sufian Shakil became runner-up with 9.5 points while GM Reefat Bin Sattar finished third with 8.5 points.

FM Mehdi Hasan Parag with 7.5 points, FM Mohammad Javed and Debaraj with seven points each finished fourth, fifth and seventh respectively.

Scots call back Hamilton for Pakistan against record

Pakistan faced a record-breaking pursuit of 440 to win the first Test against Australia at Lord's here on Thursday.

Australia were bowled out for 334 in their second innings at tea on the third day, with tail-ender Ben Hilfenhaus piling on the agony for Pakistan with a Test-best 56 not out. The highest total ever scored in a

fourth innings to win a Test is the 418 for seven made by the West Indies against Australia in Antigua in 2002-03. Pakistan's equivalent record is the 315

for nine they compiled against Australia at Karachi in 1994. These were daunting targets to better

for a Pakistan team dismissed for just 148 in their first innings and including two debutant top-order batsmen in Azhar Ali and Umar Amin.

Simon Katich again proved a thorn in Pakistan's side before he fell in sight of a century for the second time in this match.

Pakistan's plight was then compounded by both Hilfenhaus and debutant wicketkeeper Tim Paine (47) making their highest Test scores, with the Tasmanians sharing a ninth-wicket stand of 74.

No 11 Doug Bollinger also chipped in with a Test-best 21 before he was last man out, bowled by leg-spinner Danish Kaneria to end a 10th-wicket partnership

worth 52.

Australia saw their lunch score of 188 for five become 188 for seven as they lost Katich and fellow left-hander Marcus North in quick succession.

Katich, having made 80 in the first innings, was on 83 when he pushed outside off-stump against seamer Umar Gul, who finished with four for 61, and edged to wicketkeeper Kamran Akmal.

But he had put Australia in a commanding position after facing 174 balls with 14 boundaries in a four-hour stay at the crease.

Two balls later North, on 20, was drawn into driving at a Mohammad Asif delivery that cut away before Kamran Akmal took a good diving catch.

Australia were 208 for eight when Steven Smith, also making his debut, was lbw to opposing leg-spinner Kaneria.

But Paine and Hilfenhaus kept the runs coming until the keeper was bowled by the leg-spin of Pakistan captain Shahid Afridi.

Hilfenhaus though came down the pitch and outside leg-stump to hoist paceman Mohammad Asif for six over extra-cover after Pakistan had taken the newball.

And the seamer, whose previous Testbest was 20 against England at Edgbaston last year, completed a first fifty in his 10th match at this level when he pushed Kaneria for three.

Hilfenhaus, who reached the landmark in 81 balls with a six and six fours, saw his achievement applauded by team-

mates who had all gathered on the dressing room balcony in the pavilion.

Australia, after 15 wickets fell on Wednesday, resumed on 100 for four - a lead of 205.

Katich was 49 not out and nightwatchman Mitchell Johnson two not out after medium-pacer Shane Watson had taken a

Test-best five for 40. Conditions, as they had been for most of the match, were overcast and helpful to swing bowling but Katich and Johnson still compiled a fifth-wicket partnership

Johnson registered a 30 featuring five fours before he was bowled by an inswinger to give Gul a century of Test wickets.

These matches are being played in England because of security concerns in Pakistan where international cricket was effectively suspended following an armed attack on Sri Lanka's team bus in Lahore in March last year.

Imran in Hall of Fame

Pakistan legend Imran Khan became the fourth Pakistani to be inducted formally into the ICC Cricket Hall of Fame at Lord's on Wednesday.

The former captain received his commemorative cap from ICC Chief Executive Haroon Lorgat who was accompanied by Pakistan Cricket Board (PCB) chairman and International Cricket Council (ICC) director Ijaz Butt, Cricket Australia chairman and ICC director Jack Clarke and the MCC President John Barclay, who is a former Sussex teammate of Imran.

Imran joins batsmen Hanif



Mohammad and Javed Miandad as Pakistan's representatives in the initial intake of 55 players into the Hall of Fame, a joint venture between the ICC and the Federation of International

(FICA). Wasim Akram who was voted in at the end of 2009 joined the trio last year. After the presentation

during lunch at the MCC Spirit of Cricket Test match between Pakistan and Australia, Imran said: "It is a great honour to be inducted into the ICC Cricket Hall of Fame and to be recognised for my cricketing achievements for Pakistan. "I achieved many things

during my cricketing career, including winning a World Cup in 1992, but to be named amongst the initial 55 inductees, alongside Hanif and Javed makes me very proud." Imran captained Pakistan

in 48 of his 88 Test matches scoring 3,807 runs averaging 37.69, while with the ball he

claimed 362 Test wickets with an economy rate of 2.54.

His career averages put him at the top of the quartet of allrounders (fellow Hall of Fame members Sir Ian Botham, Sir Richard Hadlee and Kapil Dev being the other three) who dominated Test cricket during the 1980s.

He led Pakistan to their first series victory in England in 1987, taking 10-77 to claim victory for the side at Headingley after every other match of the series had been drawn.

The crowning glory of his 21 years at the top of international cricket came in 1992 when he led Pakistan to victory in the cricket World Cup over Graham Gooch's England by 22 runs.
