# Cairn can sell gas to third party

Govt may allow it this week; company to undertake \$100m scheme in Bay to increase gas flow to Ctg

The government may approve this week an incentive to British company Cairn allowing it to sell gas to a third party other than Petrobangla from any newly discovered gas fields in the offshore areas near Kutubdia, a highly placed Petrobangla source said.

This is the first such move in the country where gas sales is completely in control of the government. The incentive is being given by amending the production sharing contract (PSC) with Cairn for Block-16 because the company's latest find in that block appears to have very small prospect of being commercially viable.

"Without this incentive, Cairn will not proceed to spend any more money for exploration and development in this block," said the source.

" If the incentive is given, we believe Cairn will take enough initiatives that will help increase gas production in Chittagong region by next year. This is the fastest option for the government to increase gas supply to Chittagong," he said. Besides, Petrobangla will

also bag some good profit if the company can sell gas to a third party at a higher price.

Cairn discovered and developed the small offshore Sangu gas field in 1996 and had hard luck finding any commercially useful gas field ever since. It has however found another small prospect in Magnama, situated near Kutubdia island in the Bay of Bengal. Cairn last year conducted a three-dimensional seismic survey in Magnama at an investment of \$18 million and is now studying the results.

The amendment to PSC initialled nine months ago is an incentive for Cairn to carry out exploration and development in the offshore Magnama, and drill two wells in the rapidly depleting Sangu gas field.

The British company is now ready to invest \$100 million for drilling a development well in Sangu, another in South Sangu and an exploratory well in Magnama.

An official of Cairn said, "We are hoping this will give us the incentive to go ahead. If we find gas, we can then negotiate its price with prospective customers in Chittagong, and that price is going to be higher than the maximum

# DCC gets 100 eco-friendly garbage trucks

The Dhaka City Corporation will soon press into service 100 environmentally friendly garbage trucks to reduce pollution and carbon emission in the capital.

Of the vehicles, 35 are trash compactors with a capacity of up to five tonnes.

They also include 20 arm-roll carriers with a capacity of seven tonnes and 45 containers with a capacity of up to five


Tariq Bin Yousuf, project director of DCC Landfill Improvement Project, said they received the vehicles from the Japan government last month under the project, Improvement of Solid Waste in Dhaka City towards Low Carbon Society. "We have started using three compac-

tors and three arm-roll carriers in parts of the city on a trial basis. We will use all the vehicles gradually," he said. He said the environmentally friendly

vehicles could help reduce emission of one tonne of carbon dioxide a day in Dhaka. "The Dhaka City Corporation now has

around 300 garbage trucks including the open ones and other equipment. We will replace those gradually," he said.

Open trucks are not good environmen-

tally as they leave garbage and liquid waste on the streets while carrying those to dumping sites. But trash compactors and arm-roll carriers are free of this limitation, he said. Compactors have a mechanism to

coagulate solid waste. It can also separate liquid and solid waste, he said.

The compactors will collect waste directly from secondary collectors in the SEE PAGE 15 COL 5

## Indo-Pak talks must go on

Both sides say after Islamabad dialogue ended in 'failure'

India and Pakistan said yesterday they would press ahead with a dialogue to build ties shattered by the Mumbai carnage after talks in Islamabad ended in an acrimonious stalemate.

The statements came after a visit by Indian Foreign Minister SM Krishna to Islamabad ended Friday on a sour note over what his counterpart, Shah Mehmood Qureshi, said was India's "selective focus on terror".

The dialogue process "must go on" despite the chilly atmosphere, the Indian Foreign Secretary Nirupama Rao said.

"There is a gap in perception... but these are not unbridgeable divides," Rao said, but she underscored strongly that action by Islamabad to counter Islamic militant threats against India remained New Delhi's top concern. Pakistan's Prime Minister Yousuf Raza Gilani said Pakistan

also wanted the talks process to continue.

"We want dialogues, they (India) too want dialogues so when there will be talks then we will discuss all issues," Gilani told reporters at Baloki, near the eastern Pakistani city of Lahore.

However, Rao told India's NDTV network a "terror machine" directed against India involving "state and non-state actors" continues to exist in Pakistan.
