FREE EDUCATION UP TO DEGREE LEVEL

Body formed to draft policy

Stipend for female degree students from July

STAFF CORRESPONDENT

The government has formed a sub-committee to draft a policy for introducing free education up to degree level in government educational institutions and non-government institutions having Monthly Payment Order (MPO).

The sub-committee headed by Prime Minister's Principal Secretary Abdul Karim was formed yesterday at a high level meeting chaired by Planning Minister AK Khandker at his office.

The education ministry has already sent a proposal to the Executive Committee of National Economic Council to approve providing from this July a monthly stipend of Tk 200 each to at least 40 percent of female students at degree level in all government institutions and non-government ones on the MPO list, the meeting was told.

The sub-committee has been asked to draw

up a policy on setting up a Trust Fund and recommend ways to operate the fund. Besides, it has to make suggestions on how to receive donations to the fund from private sector, the public and expatriates.

At present, education is free at primary level. Planning ministry sources said the move to introduce free education up to degree level has been initiated following a directive from the prime minister. The directive was given at an Ecnec meeting on April 20. The premier also formed a committee headed by the planning minister to chalk out how free education can be introduced soon.

The sources mentioned that the education ministry has also proposed providing the female students getting stipend with an additional Tk 1,500 a year as tuition and examination fees and for buying books.

Malaysia to recruit undocumented foreign workers

Malaysia is considering recruiting undocumented foreign workers to meet the high labour demands, reports Malaysian newspaper The Staronline.

A special committee dealing with the issue of foreign workers is discussing the matter among other issues, reported the newspaper on July 16 quoting Malaysia's Human Resources Minister Datuk S Subramaniam as saying.

Such a statement comes as good news for Bangladesh, as some 50,000 to 60,000 Bangladeshi workers are believed to be living in Malaysia undocumented, said Bangladesh's Expatriates' Welfare and Overseas Employment Secretary Zafar Ahmed Khan.

If implemented, the decision will be beneficial to both the parties--the Malaysian employers can get workers easily, while the irregular Bangladeshis facing problems would get documents and employed, he said.

According to Subramaniam, Malaysia's human resources ministry was also discussing ways to address problems of abuse of foreign workers, especially domestic maids.

"The ministry is faced with two major problems in dealing with illegal immigrants in the country, namely the existence of

illegal workers and the high demand for workers by employers. Because of the high demand, illegal immigrants continue to enter the country. We are looking for a suitable mechanism to

deal with this effectively," he told a media conference at the **SEE PAGE 15 COL 6**

Thousands of blogs shut down

A web hosting company has said it shut down a blogging platform that was home to over 70,000 bloggers because a "link to terrorist material" and an al-Qaeda "hit list" was posted to the site. BurstNet said Blogetery.com also posted bomb-making instructions".

The company said it acted after receiving "a notice of a critical nature from law enforcement officials".

But the move has angered bloggers who use the platform and said they were given no notice of the shutdown.

In response Blogetery.com said its server had been "terminated without any notification or explanation."

The site added that it is trying to resolve the situation.

BurstNet defended its position.

"The posted material, in addition to potentially inciting dangerous activities, specifically violated the BurstNet acceptable use policy" said the web host firm.

BurstNet also claimed that the site had a history of previous abuse.
