of the series. For example, if in the ongoing series India beat Sri Lanka, they will gain fewer points than they will concede if they lose the series. Same goes for Australia, who are facing a much lower-ranked Pakistan. Even if Australia end the series 1-1, they will concede three rating points.

The system, though, stands to work well only if the FTP works evenly. For example, if a side spends a year playing only home series, and uses the home advantage to win series against competitive sides, its rating points will tend to misrepresent the strength and quality of the team.

# Advantage Cavendish

Thor Hushovd's early abdication has given Mark Cavendish a boost as bids to close yet another impressive Tour de France campaign with the green jersey on Sunday.

Norwegian sprinter Hushovd has been swapping the points classification's prize with Italian Alessandro Petacchi throughout most of the race.

But after his 14th place on the penultimate bunch sprint on Friday the big Cervelo sprinter no longer believes in his chances of challenging for the prize he won in 2005 and 2009.

With Petacchi now leading the competition on 213 points, with a 10 point lead on Hushovd and 16 on Cavendish, the Italian is in prime position to win the points classification.

However, with the points awarded in descending order for the first finishers on Sunday-- 35 points for the stage win, 30 for second place etc -- the green jersey battle will really go right to the line. Lampre sprinter Petacchi

Cavendish misfired, only for the Isle of Man rider to come chargingback. The ease with which Cavendish won Friday's stage, leaving Petacchi in third place,

rolled back the years to win two

stages in the opening week as

left the Italian doubting his chances of stopping the Manxman from becoming Britain's first ever green jersey winner.

"I am happy to have the green jersey again, but I know I need to make a strong sprint in Paris to win it. It will not be easy," Petacchi said.

Sunday's 20th and final stage, a 102.5km ride from Longjumeau in southwest Paris to the Champs Elysees, is usually a relaxed affair as most of the peloton celebrate simply surviving the race and the jersey winners drink Champagne.

Attacks are likely to come early once the peloton arrives in the capital, but they are likely to be brought to heel by the sprinters' teams before the eighth and

Cavendish came into the race aiming to win the green jersey, then lost hope only to be brought back into conten-

In what seems to be an effort not to break the winning spell, he is trying to keep all talk of winning the points classifica-

"I've got to try and win on the Champs Elysees, whatever the situation," said Cavendish, who annihilated his stage rivals to win on Paris's most

The search for a new head of world cricket took a step backwards Saturday when leading candidate and respected New Zealand administrator John Anderson said he was not available.

It is New Zealand and Australia's turn to nominate the next International Cricket Council (ICC) vice-president and ultimately president and Anderson was considered a certainty after original nominee John Howard was rejected. Howard, the former

Australian prime minister and a passionate cricket lover, was put forward ahead of Anderson after months of debate by Australian and New Zealand cricket officials over who would be their joint candidate. But the ICC refused to
