On food security, Hasina said her government is strongly committed to ensuring food security for every citizen and that's why agriculture has been given the top most priority.

The PM underscored the need for flourishing of agriculture industries and food processing industries in the country for removing employment problems and increasing the income of the mass people.

Hasina said already the country's scientists in collaboration with the International Rice Research Institution (IRRI) have invented salinityresilient rice.

"I think if we can apply this variety in the coastal areas, our food production will increase

to a large extent," Hasina said. Besides, the country's scientists have also invented BRRI-51 and BRRI-52 varieties of crops, which will not be harmed by rising water levels, she said.

The PM also urged the scientists and other technical people to take into account the current climate issues while researching and introducing any technology on

agriculture. She described the decoding of the jute genome sequence by Bangladeshi scientist Dr Maksudul Alam as an outstanding landmark in the history of Bangladesh and said research on jute will have

to continue. Hasina hoped that with the help of the decoded genome sequence of jute, the jute industry will get back its lost

In this regard, the PM said salary, job tenure and allowances of researchers with specific research works should be different from others.

"Researchers should be given special facilities," she added.

The PM recalled that Father of the Nation Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman had formed the Bangabandhu Krishi Fund and introduced the Bangabandhu Agriculture Award to expedite agricultural production.

Hasina said the last BNP-Jamaat government had stopped giving out the awards on political grounds.

Earlier, the PM distributed the Bangabandhu National Agriculture Awards among different personalities and institutions for their outstanding contributions and achievements in various fields of agriculture.

Three persons and two institutions received gold medals at the function at the city's Osmani Memorial auditorium. Besides, nine persons including one female received silver medals while one institution and 17 other persons received bronze medals.

Agriculture Minister Matia Chowdhury and Fisheries and Livestock Minister Abdul Latif Biswas also spoke at the function while Secretary to the Agriculture Ministry CQK Mustaq Ahmed delivered the welcome address.

Chavez threatens oil cut to the US

Venezuelan President Hugo Chavez has threatened to cut off oil supplies to the United States if it were to back a Colombian military attack on Venezuela, warning Washington to stay out of the

Chavez broke off diplomatic relations with Bogota Thursday in response to charges by President Alvaro Uribe that 1,500 Colombian guerrillas had set up camp inside Venezuela and were launching attacks from its territory.

The firebrand leftist president said on Sunday he had intelligence that "the possibility of an armed aggression against Venezuelan territory from Colombia" was higher than it has been "in 100 years."

If Colombia were to launch an attack "promoted by the Yankee empire, we would suspend oil deliveries to the United States, even if everybody over here has to eat stones," he warned.

"We wouldn't send even a single drop

of oil" to the United States, he said.

The United States is the number one consumer of oil from Venezuela, a member of the Organization of Petroleum Exporting Countries (OPEC) and South America's largest oil producer and exporter.

Chavez, who has been highly critical of a US-Colombian military base deal struck last year, called the United States "the great instigator" behind Venezuela's current conflict with Colombia.

About 20,000 Venezuelan troops deployed along the 2,000-kilometer (1,250-mile) border with Colombia have been placed under "maximum alert," according to military officials. The United States on Friday threw its support behind its key ally Colombia in

its latest row with Venezuela, calling Chavez's decision to sever diplomatic relations with Colombia and put border troops on alert "a petulant response" to Bogota's accusations.

Chavez on Sunday hinted at a possi-

ble easing of tensions with Colombia when president-elect Juan Manuel Santos replaces Uribe on August 7.

But in an op-ed piece published in several newspapers, the Venezuelan leader warned that his country "must get clear and unambiguous signs that Colombia's new government has real political will to resume the path of dialogue."

Santos, who is on a tour of Latin America, has refused to comment on the crisis, referring the matter to the outgoing president.

Venezuela "will present a peace proposal to Colombia" at Thursday's meeting in Quito of the Union of South American Nations (Unasur), Venezuela's Foreign Minister Nicolas Maduro said.

Chavez also announced Sunday he would cancel a planned trip to Cuba in light of the crisis.

He had been due to attend yesterday in Havana the 57th anniversary of Fidel Castro's rebel attack on the Moncada barracks that kicked off the revolution | home, and he blew himself up that brought him to power in 1959.

Pak suicide bomber targets mourners

Seven killed

A suicide bomb near Peshawar has killed seven people near a gathering mourning a cabinet minister's son murdered in a suspected Taliban attack, police

About 20 people were also injured when the bomber struck on foot near the home of **Provincial Information Minister** Mian Iftikhar Hussain in the town of Pabbi.

Three policemen and four civilians died. The minister was not among the mourners.

The Taliban told the BBC they killed his 28-year-old only son two days ago.

Yesterday's suicide bombing near a mosque where mourners had gathered damaged several shops and scattered human flesh in the town, 26km (16 miles) east of Peshawar.

Police said the attacker had been dropped off by a man on a motorcycle near the minister's after an officer challenged him.

personnel as they have been absconding since the incident took place on February 25-26, 2009. The court also passed an order to attach their proper-

The court further granted the appeal submitted by the investigation officer (IO) of the case for dropping the names of 1483 from the charge sheet as their involvement with the killings was not proved.

However, the persons who were dropped from the charge sheet would be tried under the mutiny act and they would not be released, said sources.

The court directed officersin-charge (OC) of different police stations to submit by August 25 reports on execution of arrest warrants against the 21 BDR personnel.

The Criminal Investigation Department on July 12 indicted 824 BDR soldiers and civilians on 24 criminal charges in connection with the mutiny.

The charges include murder, arson, looting, hiding of bodies, and sedition.

CID's Special Superintendent Abdul Kahar Akand, also the IO of the case, submitted the charge sheet against former BNP lawmaker Nasiruddin Ahmed Pintu, former leader of a Dhaka city ward unit of Awami League Torab Ali, and BNP backed former city ward commissioner Suraiya Begum.

The much talked about BDR deputy assistant director (DAD) Mohammad Towhidul Islam was made the prime indictee.

The indicted are six DADs, 44 subedars, 80 havildars, 60 nayeks, 68 lance nayeks, 504 sepoys, 14 cooks, two peons, and 23 civilians.

The charge sheet also showed 21 BDR personnel as absconding since the mutiny. The IO prayed for issuance of arrest warrants against them, and an order for confiscating their properties.

The IO also said the mutiny was staged based on some pentup resentment among BDR soldiers regarding some

demands. He said the indicted BDR members and civilians held several meetings inside and outside the BDR Headquarters

prior to the mutiny. The indictees looted arms breaking armouries, raided Darbar Hall of the BDR Headquarters, sprayed bullets there and at different other places in Pilkhana killing 74

officers, he said. A total of 2,307 were arrested so far in connection with the mutiny, 2,282 of them were taken on remand, and 543 gave confessional statements.
