Paragraph Writing!

A paragraph has three parts. A 'topic sentence' is the first part that allows the readers to understand what you are writing about. The 'middle part' of the paragraph contains sentences that follow one after another in a logical sequence. The last part or the 'conclusion' closes your subject with an emphasis on the final product.

Paragraphs can be developed in a number of different ways. See the following examples:

A DESCRIPTIVE PARAGRAPH describes a process or a sequence of events, or the characteristics or the structure of something. In a descriptive paragraph we can describe a person or a place or an event using vivid images that refer to smell, touch, sound, taste, personality, behaviour etc. Some topics of descriptive paragraphs are:

- -My Village
- -My Favourite Hobby
- -The Flowers of Bangladesh

A NARRATIVE PARAGRAPH is also descriptive, but it gives some background information, such as, a description of past events. Generally, in a narrative paragraph we use our point of view to tell a story. Some topics of narrative paragraphs are:

- -My First Day at School
- -1952 Language Movement
- -A Journey by Boat

An EXPLANATORY PARAGRAPH may provide information about a subject, or give directions, or show how something happens. Some topics of explanatory paragraphs are:

- -Global Warming -Pollution in Dhaka City
- -Balanced Diet

A PERSUASIVE PARAGRAPH tries to convince the reader about an issue and may provide recommendations. Therefore, these paragraphs require dynamic language. Some topics of persuasive paragraphs are:

- -Banning Smoking in Public Places
- -Compulsory High School Education for All
- -Abolishing Poverty from Bangladesh

Why high school students should wear uniforms

Paragraph Writing TIPS

Start with an effective 'topic sentence' that includes the 'topic' and 'the idea' which controls the whole paragraph.

To develop the paragraph; write 2-5 'supporting details' that support the topic sentence.

In 'supporting details' you can use RENNS which means 'reasons', 'examples', 'names', 'numbers' and 'senses'.

Organize the sentences and ideas in a logical manner and ensure the normal flow.

Write a 'concluding sentence' that summarizes the whole paragraph.

Always limit your paragraph to a single idea or a point.

The first sentence of a paragraph is very important. Make it as strong as you can.

The conclusion brings all ideas together. So, make it strong also.
