A strong, central body should be formed to monitor the nongovernment organisations (NGOs) to bring transparency and accountability in their activities, Agriculture Minister Matia Chowdhury said yesterday.

"The NGOs get funds from donor agencies for socioeconomic development of the country's marginal communities. But there is no strong monitoring of their activities. There should be a central body to keep vigilance on what they do," she said. She observed that a section of NGO officials do not spend the

donation money properly. "They [officials] seem more interested in changing their lifestyle rather than changing the fate of the underprivileged." The minister made the comments while speaking as the chief guest at the inaugural session of a conference on good governance

Religious bigots vandalised and looted at least 10 houses of the Ahmadiyyas in Chandtara village of the district's Ghatail upazila early yesterday.

Irate at the move to build an Ahmadiyya mosque in the area, they attacked the houses at around 2:00am and continued pillaging till 6:00am in the morning, local sources said.

Earlier on Saturday, 10 Ahmadiyyas were injured in an attack while returning from the foundation-laying ceremony of the mosque.

Abu Taher Akhand, a member of the Ahmadiyya community, told The Daily Star that paddy, furniture, livestock and household items worth around Tk 10 lakh were looted from his house.
