Constitutional recognition to Adivasis demanded

With the demand for constitutional recognition to the Adivasis in Bangladesh, the two-day fair and cultural programme ended at Shishu Academy in the city yesterday.

Speakers at the closing ceremony said constitutional recognition is required to ensure basic rights and improve social status of the indigenous people.

Manusher Jonno Foundation (MJF) and its associate organisations arranged the fair. A total of 23 Adivasi organisations participated in the event. They displayed

products used in their daily life. A number of indigenous art works also went on show.

The programme was organised marking the International Day of the World's Indigenous People celebrated every year on August 9 across the world.

Jyotirindra Bodhipriya Larma popularly known as Shantu Larma, chairman of the CHT Regional Council said, the path to equal rights is long for the indigenous people of this country because the government is still hesitant about giving right status to the indigenous people

through constitutional recognition. Executive Director of MJF Shaheen

Anam said people of Bangladesh fought in 1971 to create a secular, oppression-

free democratic country for every one. "We regularly witness violation of

human rights of many segments of the country, including the indigenous people." It goes against the spirit of the war of

independence, she added. Prof Sourav Sikder of the Linguistics department of Dhaka University and Tondra Chakma, programme manager of MJF, also spoke at the event.

The event ended with a prize giving ceremony to the best stalls at the fair and a vibrant cultural show.

More hospitals to be built at city gateways, says Dr Ruhal

Health and Family Welfare Minister Dr AFM Ruhal Haque yesterday said the government would build necessary numbers of general hospitals at the main gateways of the city with a view to expanding the healthcare services to increasing population.

"Two 500-bed general hospitals in the city's Kurmitola and Khilgoan areas will start operations from June next year," he told reporters after visiting the construction works of 500-bed Kurmitola General Hospital in Dhaka Cantonment.

The Kurmitola General Hospital, being established with a budget of the Health and Family Welfare Ministry, will provide healthcare to both civil and military

Referring to the government decision to build more children's hospitals beside the city, Dr Ruhal Haque said another general hospital like the Kurmitola and Khilgoan would be built in the Mirpur

He said the city dwellers are being deprived of taking healthcare services in balanced manner as the main public hospitals are situated in the central part of the capital due to lack of proper plan.

Besides, the patients coming from the distant places face a lot of suffering to reach the city hospitals, he said, adding that if the hospitals are built at the gateways of the city their sufferings and diffi-

"For this the government is putting emphasis on such places to build hospitals," he said.

Replying to a question, he reiterated that stern action would be taken against the dodgy doctors who will remain absent from discharging their duties at the public hospitals across the country.

Prison authorities asked not to transfer Milon to another jail

The High Court (HC) yesterday directed the prison authorities not to transfer ANM Ehsanul Haque Milon, BNP leader and former state minister for education, to another jail without permission of the court.

Milon, an accused in 14 criminal cases, is now in Comilla jail.

The court, however, said Milon can be transferred to any other jail on medical grounds.

An HC bench of Justice MA Wahhab Miah and Justice Kazi Reza-ul Huq passed the order following a writ petition filed by Nazmun Nahar Baby, wife of Milon, on behalf of her husband.

She stated in the petition that the authorities have transferred Milon to one jail to another jail for at least 15 times after he was sent to prison on March 14 this vear.

Milon has become seriously ill due to his transfers from jails time and again, the petitioner said.

Advocate Khandker Mahbub Hossain and Advocate Gazi Kamrul Islam Sajal appeared for the petitioner.

2,466 more arrested

10 injured in Sylhet clash

At least 10 persons including four policemen were injured in a clash between the supporters of "Amra Sylhetbashi" and police at the city's Zindabazar yesterday afternoon.

Of the injured lawmen, Subeder Nasir was admitted to Sylhet MAG Osmani Medical College Hospital.

Police said Jamaat-Shibir activists took out the procession from the city's Registry Maidan at about 4:15pm protesting the price hike of essentials and welcoming the holy month of Ramadan.

Officer in Charge (OC) of Kotwali police station Khondaker Naoroj Ahmed said the procession was drawn without the permission of Sylhet Metropolitan Police. When the procession reached Zindabazar,

police asked the demonstrators to stop but they refused, the OC said. The protesters hurled bricks and hit some

policemen with stick, which instigated the lawmen to use tear gas and charge baton to disperse the mob, police said.

Four persons were arrested in this connection, the OC added.
