The High Court yesterday directed the health secretary to turn in within four weeks a report on population growth over the last 10 years in the country.

The court also asked the secretary to set out the budgetary allocations for controlling population boom during the period.

The HC order came after four Supreme Court lawyers --Manzill Murshid, Sarwar Ahad Chowdhury, Asaduzzaman Siddique and Tapan Kumar Das -- filed a writ petition as public interest litigation yesterday.
