



Six boys from Dhaka found in Chittagong

Police rescued six adolescent boys from Sholoshahar in the port city yesterday afternoon. All of them hailed from

Jatrabari and adjoining areas in the capital, police said. Acting on a tip-off, a police team from Khulshi police station came to Sholoshahar

Railway Station and caught

the boys at around 5:00pm. Officer in Charge (OC) Iftekhar Hassan of the police station said during interrogation the children said they came on a trip to Chittagong

from Dhaka by train yesterday. They are investigating whether the children, now in police custody, were kidnapped for trafficking, said the OC.

The boys are Sajjad, 11, son of Swapan, Solaiman, 7, son of Yusuf Mistri, Shuvo alias Rabbi, 6, son of Omar Faruq, Md Zakir Hossain, 7, son of Md Kamal Hossain and Nur Mohammad, 8, son of Siraj, all hailing from Jatrabari in Dhaka.

Md Saddam, 10, son of Nousher, hailed from Kajla Gate No 4 of Demra in the capital.



DoE for removal of CCC-owned filling station within 30 days

Department of Environment (DoE) headquarters in Dhaka yesterday served Chittagong City Corporation (CCC) a notice to remove its CNG filling station from the Premier University Campus within next 30 working days.

Director (enforcement) Mohammad Munir Chowdhury of DoE issued the notice as part of the ongoing drive against the environmental pollution in the port city and Chittagong district.

The CNG filling station adjacent to CCC run Premier University building at Dampara had been posing a high risk of accident to several hundred students, said the notice adding it is also causing health hazards.

The station also did not have environmental certificate as required under Bangladesh Environment Protection Act, it said.

Move to recruit 101 judges with FF quota

The government has taken initiatives to appoint 101 assistant judges and judicial magistrates in lower courts across the country with a 30 percent quota for the children of freedom fighters for the first time.

Bangladesh Judicial Service Commission (BJSC) selects candidates for these posts by holding tests and examinations as per requirements of the government. And the president then appoints them.

About 200 posts of assistant judge and judicial magistrate are now vacant, official sources

said. The BJSC issued a circular in June seeking applications from intending candidates for the

posts and fixed September 24 for a preliminary test carrying 100 marks. Over 3,000 applied. As permitted by the Supreme Court, the

move to select 101 candidates for the posts of assistant judge and judicial magistrate. But the process was withheld later as the government decided to formulate rules providing for the 30 percent quota. In November, the law ministry took an

initiative to make the rules but it could not complete the process due to bureaucratic tangles, sources said.

The government this year prayed to the SC to permit it to recruit lower court judges with a 30 percent quota for freedom fighters' children although the rules were yet to be made.

In June, the apex court permitted this. Meanwhile, 207 judges and judicial magis-

trates were appointed last year.

Sources mentioned that the government decided to introduce the quota for freedom fighters' children in judicial service since there

The BNP committee formed to review the court judgment on the fifth amendment apparently stand divided over the party's official statement on the verdict.

BNP leaders and lawmakers, who are legal practitioners, remain split over the statement as some want to question the judiciary's jurisdiction over parliamentary affairs while others are unwilling to say anything against the judiciary, said party insiders. The lawmakers serving as counsels want to focus only on the

part of the verdict dealing with political and religious matters. They fear the court might get annoyed if too many questions are raised about the judiciary's role.

The Appellate Division of the Supreme Court in February upheld the High Court ruling of 2005 that had declared the fifth amendment to the constitution illegal.

The apex court released full text of its judgment on July 27.
