Gas there, not linked to supply network


\$900m investment needed to set up pipelines, double gas production

Experts have found out that the country's existing gas crisis was created due mainly to lack of adequate pipeline system, not necessarily for unavailability of enough

In a study submitted to the energy ministry late last month, the experts have pinpointed the need to take up a dozen pipeline projects urgently to evacuate gas from upcoming gas production in next five years.

Of these projects, two or three pipelines are cross-country and highly critical.



Without these projects, all bids to reduce the country's gas crisis would fail.

These pipeline projects would need around \$900 million investment till 2015, says the study prepared by Petrobangla, Gas Transmission Company Ltd (GTCL) and Titas Gas Transmission and Distribution System Ltd (TGTDCL).

The country's present gas consumption is 2,000 million cubic feet per day (mmcfd), with a short supply of 400 mmcfd. Of this gas production, foreign oil companies produce a little bit more than the national companies do.

One of the experts noted that if there were adequate pipelines, at least 130 mmcfd gas could have been supplied to the national grid from Jalalabad and Bibiyana gas fields as of today. He added the Jalalabad field has the capability to

SUGAR, EDIBLE OIL

Prices found spiked before, after drive

Manik was sealing packets of sugar with the heat of candlelight in his tiny shop at Hatirpul kitchen market when a group of strangers came

up and asked how much it costs. Manik said Tk 50 a kg, Tk 3 more than the

government set price. "We lose sugar of a good amount when we pack the loose sugar," he explained when one of the strangers asked him why the difference. "Moreover, we have to adjust the transportation cost while pricing."

Unfortunately for Manik, the man asking questions was Commerce Secretary M Golam Hossain. And he was being accompanied by a government team that spent its first day monitoring prices of sugar and edible oil in different kitchen markets of the city.

The result: Manik's shop was fined Tk 20,000

on the spot for charging more than the government set prices.

Manik was not alone. The inspection teams yesterday assessed Tk 2.74 lakh in fines against food merchants in Hatirpul, Karwan Bazar, New Market and Kalmilata market yesterday.

But the teams hardly made a dent in the higher prices. A spot check before and after their sweeps in kitchen markets found sugar and edible oil prices higher than permitted.

The price of non-branded sugar hovered between Tk 49 and Tk 50, compared to the government's mandated Tk 47. And the price of super palm oil was as much as Tk 78, two taka more than the legal amount. Soya bean oil prices, however, were under or at the government limit of Tk 80 a litre.

CHEMICALS WAREHOUSES SHIFTING

Deadline widens to Sept 30

Taskforce to conduct drive in Old Dhaka

The government yesterday decided to extend the deadline for shifting warehouses that store combustible chemical in Old Dhaka till September 30.

Considering the month of Ramadan, the government has made the decision, said Industries Minister Dilip Barua after a meeting of the national Productivity Organisation (NPO) at the ministry.

The earlier deadline expired yesterday.

"A taskforce will carry out a drive against storage of 20 selected flammable chemicals in the area from September 20 to 30," said the industries minister, adding that a joint team comprising of local members of parliaments, representative of Dhaka district administration and the taskforce will monitor the relocation process.
