Clashes after protester dies in Kashmir

Stone-hurling protesters fought police yesterday after : the death of a young man : injured in a clash with security . forces in restive Indian Kashmir, police said.

The latest death brought to : 58 the number of protesters and bystanders killed in two months of violent protests in the mainly Muslim region, most of them young men or teenagers shot : dead by security forces.

The man had been injured : in southern Anantnag town · Friday and died in hospital: Tuesday, police said.

His said he had been ; beaten by security forces during an anti-India protest : but police said he had been . injured in a stampede during a clash between security forces: and protesters.

"We have clamped a curfew: on the town in an attempt to . prevent further unrest," a ; police officer said, asking not : to be named.

Meanwhile, in Indian Kashmir summer capital · Srinagar young protesters clashed with security forces in . several places, police said.

Bombs kill eight civilians in Afghanistan

Roadside bombs in Afghanistan killed eight civilians, including at least three women and a child, police said yesterday.

Among the deaths was Zakaria Khan, an influential tribal elder who was killed Tuesday in an explosion in the southern province of Kandahar, said Zalmai Ayoubi, a provincial government spokesman.

Khan, a pro-government tribal chieftain, died in his timber shop in the town of Spin Boldak on the Pakistan border, Ayoubi said. The blast appeared as if someone had thrown a hand grenade, he added.

Two other elders there were injured, he added.

A remote-controlled bomb on a motorcycle parked on a bridge in the southern city of Ghazni detonated prematurely on Tuesday, killing two passers-by and wounding another five, including two children, police told AFP.

The blast took place just as a police convoy was about to pass, said Mohammad Osman, commander of Afghanistan's southeastern police zone.

"Two civilians were martyred and another five were wounded," he said.

The bomber had been planning to trigger the device by remote control and was injured in the explosion and has been arrested, Osman said.

In a similar incident late Monday, a roadside bomb ripped through a civilian vehicle in Shindand district, in the western province of Herat, killing five civilians and injuring two, said Lal Mohammad Omarzai, the district chief.

"Three women, a man and a child were killed and two other women were hurt," he said.

UN battles donor fatigue for funds for Pak floods

Only a small fraction of the six million Pakistanis desperate for food and clean water have received any help as the United Nations battled donor fatigue and appealed urgently yesterday for more funds.

With hundreds of villages marooned and highways and bridges cut in half by swollen rivers, food rations and access to clean water have only been provided to around 500,000 million flood survivors, the UN said.

The United Nations has warned that up to 3.5 million children could be in danger of contracting deadly diseases carried through contaminated water and insects in a crisis that has disrupted the lives of at least a tenth of Pakistan's 170 million people.

"We have a country which has endemic watery diarrhoea, endemic cholera, endemic upper respiratory infections and we have the conditions for much expanded problems," Unicef Regional Director for South Asia Daniel Toole told a news conference.

"We cannot spend pledges. We cannot buy purification tablets, we cannot support Pakistan with pledges. I urge the international community to urgently change pledges into

checks."

Up to 1,600 people have been killed and two million made homeless in Pakistan's worst floods in decades. The United Nations has reported the first case of cholera, but only a quarter of the \$459 million aid needed for initial relief has arrived. ANGELINA JOLIE TO VISIT FLOOD VICTIMS

Pakistan as "unbelievable". Public anger has grown in the two weeks of floods, highlighting potential political troubles for President Asif Ali Zardari's unpopular government, which is a major US ally in the war against Islamist militancy.

"Only a limited proportion of food and water needs have been met. One of the major reasons for this is funding," UN spokesman Maurizio Giuliano told Reuters, adding the flood's slower unravelling compared to earthquakes and Tsunamis had dampened donor response.

3 die in floods in Spain

Spain's government says three people have died in flash floods in towns close to southern city of Cordoba.

The Interior Ministry says one man was found dead Tuesday morning in a car that had been washed away in torrential overnight rain in the small town of Aguilar de la Frontera.

The ministry says the body of a woman who also had been in the vehicle was found some 150 meters (165 yards) away.

Another man was killed when an exterior wall of his house collapsed on top of him in the nearby town of Bujalance.

Television images showed damaged cars piled together along mud-packed streets in Aguilar while people mopped out their houses.

Cordoba is one of several southern provinces on alert for heavy rains.

Karzai orders private security firm closures

Private security companies will have to end operations in Afghanistan in four months, President Hamid Karzai has ordered.

He issued the ultimatum to the companies in a decree signed in Kabul.

The decision is expected to be met with resistance from Nato forces who use private contractors as guards for convoys and on

Mr Karzai pledged to limit the operations of security companies when he was sworn in as president last year.

Private contractors will have to either disband or join the Afghan police, according to the order read out by Mr Karzai yesterday. Contractors working for international embassies and non-

governmental organisations will be exempt from the decree, as

long as security personnel stay within their compounds, the order says. "After some thorough and legal review I am approving the annulment of foreign and national security companies within

four months," Mr Karzai said. There have been "tragic incidents" where the actions of private contractors had led to the deaths of innocent Afghan

civilians, he said. There are 52 companies, both international and domestic,

registered with the government. There are many more unregistered companies roaming Afghanistan without uniforms or supervision, says the BBC's Quentin Somerville in Kabul.
