

# Better Business Forum abolished

PM urges businessmen to be more responsible towards people, society

The government yesterday abolished the Bangladesh Better Business Forum (BBBF) and approved a 299-member organogram of Board of Investment (BoI).

The decision was taken at the 25th meeting of Board of Investment (BoI) held at PM's Office with Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina in the chair. The BBBF was formed in 2007 with the aim of improving the business environment in

Bangladesh through interactions between the business community and government officials. The meeting also approved the minutes of

the 24th meeting of the BOI held in July last year, said PM's Press Secretary Abul Kalam Azad while briefing newsmen after the meeting.

Speaking at the meeting, the premier directed the BoI to take more steps to ease all procedures for the foreign as well as expatriate Bangladeshi entrepreneurs so that they can invest more in the country.

She informed the meeting that foreign investors are coming to Bangladesh with more money and they must be given more congenial trade atmosphere to bring momentum to national economy.

"More investment would come if we can ensure adequate power and gas for the investors," she added.

#### TAX EVASION CASE Sayedee, Mir Kashem face arrest warrants

A Dhaka court yesterday issued arrest warrants against Jamaat-e-Islami Nayeb-e-Ameer Delwar Hossain Sayedee and party leader Mir Kashem Ali hours after the National Board of Revenue (NBR) filed two separate cases against them for tax evasion.

Sayedee was charged for dodging income tax amounting to Tk 56.45 lakh for the fiscal years from 2005-2006 to 2009-2010 while Kashem for evading income tax of Tk 11.27 lakh in the 2005-2006 fiscal year.
