



Kitchen market set up occupying footpath

Community police run the market in Uttara

The community police are running an illegal kitchen market on a portion of footpath on Jasim Uddin Road in Uttara, disrupting movements of passers-by and ruining the beauty of the area.

The makeshift shops, which were evicted during the caretaker government regime more than once, were rebuilt on the footpath in sector-1 six months ago.

The footpath is along the boundary wall of Civil Aviation Authority of Bangladesh (CAAB) in the area, one of whose officials says they cannot do anything against this illegal occupation since it is outside their wall.

"They were back in business initially

on rickshaw-vans after the Awami League government took office, and started to set up bamboo-made structures around six months back," said Shahidul Islam Dulal, an official of Creative Destination, a concern of Shanto Mariyam Foundation, located on the same road.

Md Isak Azad, president of Chhinnomul Khudra Beboshahi Community Police, under whose banner the market is running, acknowledged the occupation saying they are doing it to on their walkway forces them to take the earn a living. The kitchen market is run by unit-2 of the community police, which has some 300 members, under Airport remains and other market wastes are Police Station.

"We've no other income sources as we

do a voluntary job. That's why we're running the illegal market," Azad said.

Selim Khan, an executive member of the Chhinnomul Khudra Beboshahi Community Police, however, said they had applied to the Dhaka City Corporation (DCC) seeking permission to run the market.

"Authorities in sector-1 don't take any steps as none of their sector live near the market," said Md Shobebarat, a resident of Jasim Uddin Road, adding, the market busy, main street.

Railway sources said the disruption occurred after a Sylhet-bound train 'Joyontika' from Dhaka hit a sand-laden truck at Lashkarpur level crossing in Sylhet at about 7:00pm Thursday.

3 wounded in ansar firing

At least three people, including a woman, were wounded as ansar members opened fire at a mob in the city's Swamibagh yesterday.

The ansar members, working for Rupayan Real Estate Company, went into the violent action following an altercation with the local slum dwellers over construction of a wall on a disputed land near Mitali School in the area under Sutrapur Police Station.

Injured Ripon Miah, 25, received two bullets in his abdomen and back while Kulsum Begum, 50, one in her hand and her husband Abu Taher, 65, one in his abdomen, police said.

They were admitted to the Dhaka Medical College Hospital (DMCH), and the condition of Ripon was stated to be critical.

Witness Dolly Begum said the ansar men picked up Ripon alleging that he damaged a portion of the under-construction wall and later beat him up before shooting him. Taher and his wife Kulsum received bullets as the ansar men sprayed bullets at SEE PAGE 15 COL 1

BEATEN BY BDR Rashidul's body found in river

Police yesterday recovered the body of Rashidul Islam from the river Dharla near Kolakhawa Ghat in Sadar upazila of Lalmonirhat.

The body bore several marks of injury, Mohammad Sobhan, sub-inspector of Sadarthana, said.

Rashidul was beaten to death allegedly by Bangladesh Rifles personnel near Mogholhat border area of the

upazila Tuesday night. The BDR men later threw away the body into the river, victim's family members

BNP struggles to form 11 district units

Main opposition BNP struggles to form some district units because of conflicts among local leaders, who have influence over the party's high command.

The party asked its six joint secretaries general to resolve disputes among local leaders and form committees in 15 districts by this month.

BNP plans to organise a long march after Eid as part of its anti-government programmes following formation of the committees. Party

Chairperson Khaleda Zia will lead the programme to protest the deals signed recently between Bangladesh and India.

A number of party leaders responsible for settling intra-party conflicts have blamed some central leaders for the deadlock saying they want to see their loyal supporters in the committee.

BNP central body will announce committees if local leaders fail to reach a consensus on formation of their units.

FEUD OVER COMMISSION

AL men force workers to stop dev work

Sujanagar upazila unit Awami League activists stopped development work of four projects under Local Government Engineering Department (LGED) yesterday due to a feud over "negotiation money."

AL men led by unit president Abul Kashem and secretary Abdul Wahab forced workers to stop the road and bridge construction works conducted by contractors from the district headquarters, sources said.

The contractors, who get contracts for any development work, usually pay the "negotiation money" to the other contractors who take part in a bidding.

Since the contractors from Pabna did not pay the money this time, Sujanagar AL leaders who back local contractors declared that no Pabna contractors would be allowed in the upazila.

"Pabna contractors take 'negotiation money' from us when we carry out any development work there, but they don't give when it's their time to pay money," AL leader Abdul Wahab told The Daily Star. "Whenever we want our percentage they attack us."

Sujanagar AL leaders alleged that a few contractors of Sujanagar were assaulted in the district headquarters by some AL men recently.



Cop Manjurul an inspiration for others

Police constable Manjurul Islam was responsible throughout his professional life, even on the day he was killed while on duty at a checkpost at Motijheel yesterday.

Wiping tears, Manjurul's wife Salma Akter said, "Our one and a half years old daughter Marzana was trying to tie her father's hands with hers to stop him from going out on the day and he [Manjurul] said he will come in the morning".

Choked with tears, she let the words out, "He could not meet his daughter in the morning". Witnesses said Manjurul was intercepting vehicles and frisk-

ing passengers even in the rain that night.

"Suddenly Manjurul shouted out that he [a passenger of an auto-rickshaw] carries a gun," Jamaluddin, a security guard of Pubali Filling Station, adjacent to the checkpost, told The Daily Star.

He said the criminal shot him [Manjurul] in the chest but Manjurul did not let him go. Soon after the incident two of his colleagues came to his rescue and the criminal fired a bullet leaving another policeman injured. Police then shot the criminal dead.

Sabbir Hossain, one of Manjurul's batch mates, said

Manjurul had shown signs of bravery during the training period. Meanwhile, police yesterday afternoon filed a murder case
