# kills ten

At least 10 people died and three were hospitalised in a span of 24 hours due to drinking of toxic liquor at a village in Osmani Nagar till yesterday.

About 15 to 20 people consumed the poisonous liquor at Paschim Goalabazar between Friday afternoon and yesterday afternoon and fell sick within the next few hours, said Nirmalendu Chakravarty, officer-in-charge of Osmani Nagar Police Station.

The patients were severely vomiting and had other complications when they arrived, hospital sources said.

Two of the deceased Faruk Miah, 45, from Eolatoil village and Harun Khan, 35 from Shosharkandi died at MAG Osmani Medical College Hospital Friday afternoon.

Five others including the seller of the liquor Goyesh Miah, 30 from Nogrikapon, Chittaranjan Das, 40 and Kanu Chandra Das, 50 from Das Para, Jhontu Dev, 30 of Ekarai and Zilu Miah, 40 from Brahman Gram died on Saturday.

Superintendent of Police, Md. Shakhawat Hossain told the Daily Star yesterday afternoon, that the police caught the dealer, Goyesh Miah, Saturday morning. However, as he had consumed **SEE PAGE 15 COL 6** 

# Tailbacks mock bids to tackle traffic

Vehicular movement on the city streets has apparently been left to its own device resulting in tedious tailbacks while the Dhaka Metropolitan Police is trying to figure out a fitting traffic management system for Dhaka.

The DMP had adopted the three-lane system and made other subsequent steps imitating models of developed countries. It ignored the existing structure and varieties of vehicle-modes and has put the traffic movement in a total mess, said experts.

The traffic authorities approached the situation almost in an unplanned

manner switching from one system to another over the last few months.

DMP traffic wing chief Shafiqur Rahman said, "We partially backtracked from our earlier three-lane system--one lane is for private cars, microbuses and jeeps, one for minibuses, buses, covered vans and trucks and the rest for CNG-run auto-rickshaws, pickup vans, motorbikes and other vehicles-- introduced last December."

He said since August 8 they were trying to prevent overtaking vehicles by forcing them to follow each other in rows instead of using the three-lane system but the traffic department failed to implement it due to lack of manpower.

"Motorised vehicles will ply in rows ignoring the modes," he said adding they again started manual system for controlling traffic instead of the traffic lights,

The way the three-lane system has been introduced will not give commuters respite from tailback, said Shamsul Haque, director of accident research institute of Bangladesh University of Engineering and Technology. It just

Most vehicles approaching intersections change lanes so that they could go to their desired directions and this changing of lanes clogs the streets, the

### Koko placed 2009's medical certificate

Home ministry says parole cancelled as per rule; Koko's lawyer submits fresh plea for parole extension

Violation of conditions and the opposition's threat to forge movement to bring BNP Chairperson Khaleda Zia's sons Arafat Rahman Koko and Tarique Rahman back to the country apparently led to Koko's parole cancellation.

As per the parole conditions,

Koko was supposed to inform his whereabouts to the Bangladesh Embassy in Bangkok every three days but he did not do so, said a top home

ministry official yesterday asking not to be identified.

Moreover, he applied for further extension of parole a couple of weeks ago and attached a medical certificate to substantiate the cause. But the medical certificate was issued on November 17, 2009, which is very old and unacceptable to the government, the official added.
