Bayern leave it late

Bayern Munich needed a stoppage-time winner from Bastian Schweinsteiger to beat VfL Wolfsburg 2-1 and successfully kick off their Bundesliga title defence on Friday.

Bayern, who were missing injured winger Arjen Robben and striker Ivica Olic, were the livelier

side early on, with Franck Ribery in superb form. With Germany coach Joachim Loew in the stands and the game seen in 197 countries, World Cup joint top scorer Thomas Mueller fired the hosts into the lead in the ninth minute after combining beautifully with Toni Kroos.

Last season's Bundesliga top scorer Edin Dzeko grabbed a deserved 55th-minute equaliser for Wolfsburg when he headed in a Zvjezdan Misimovic corner to give fired-up former England coach Steve McClaren a reason to smile on his Bundesliga debut.

Bayern hit back deep into added time when an unmarked Schweinsteiger tapped in a Ribery cross at the far post.

Schalke 04, runners-up last season, take on Hamburg SV on Saturday while Werder Bremen, who finished third, visit Hoffenheim.

Bayern coach Louis van Gaal opted for a new-look central defence with Holger Badstuber partnering Daniel van Buyten, Schweinsteiger, who tapped it in.

leaving out Argentine Martin Demichelis, who angrily refused to sit on the substitutes' bench before the start of the game.

Ribery, after a troubled last season, looks to have hit top form at the right time and was a constant threat with furious runs down the left wing and some pin-point passing.

Yet it was Kroos, back this season after his loan spell at Bayer Leverkusen, who set up Mueller for the first goal.

Diego Contento came close to adding another when Ribery fed him inside the box but the defender was denied by Wolfsburg keeper Diego Benaglio.

McClaren brought on playmaker Misimovic in the second half to add pace and precision in midfield and two minutes after the restart Croatian Mario Mandzukic rattled Bayern's post with a beautifully-curled, low shot.

Dzeko saw his drive sail just wide a minute later as Bayern looked out of sorts.

McClaren, whose last encounter with Bayern was as a Manchester United assistant coach in their victorious 1999 Champions League final, was by now on his feet, yelling at his players to keep pressing.

They did just that and it was Dzeko who delivered when he rose above Van Buyten to head in the equaliser.

Manchester United defender Nemanja Vidic signed a new four-year contract with the Premier League club on Friday.

United announced last month that Vidic had agreed to extend his stay at Old Trafford and the Serbian centre-back has now officially sealed the deal.

The 28-year-old had been linked with moves to AC Milan and Real Madrid as reports claimed he was unhappy in Manchester, but he will now remain with Sir Alex Ferguson's team until 2014.

"We are delighted Nemanja has committed his future to the club," Ferguson said. "This kills all the silly speculation

over the past few months. "Nemanja has developed into one of the best centrehalves in Europe and we are pleased he will be here for many years to come."

Vidic moved to United from Spartak Moscow for 7.2 million pounds (8.8 million euros) in 2005 and has helped the team win three league titles, as well as the Champions League in 2008.
