\$157m WB credit to improve rural livelihoods

UNB, Dhaka

The government yesterday signed two credit agreements worth 157 million US dollar for the 'Empowerment and livelihood improvement project, known as the Notun Jibon Project, and additional financing for the on-going Municipal Services Project.

The agreements were signed at the Economic Relations Division (ERD).

ERD Secretary M Musharraf Hossain Bhuiyan and World Bank Country Director Ellen Goldstein signed on behalf of their respective side, said a World Bank press release.

The credit from the International Development Association (IDA), the World Bank's concessional lending arm, has 40 years to maturity, including a 10year grace period; and carries a service charge of 0.75 percent.

According to the press release, 115 million US dollar provided for the Notun

Jibon supports the second phase of a 12-15 year community-driven development programme focused on the poorest dis-

It will improve the quality of life and the livelihoods of poor households in rural areas while helping to build resilience to climate change and natural disasters, it said.

The second phase will scale up results from the first phase, which included completion of 1,700 community infrastructure projects as local roads, culverts, bridges; creation of 22,000 women's savings groups; skill enhancement and job creation for 75,000 vulnerable youths; and skills training and income generation for 30,000 of the poorest and most vulnerable individuals.

"Our new country strategy to support Bangladesh underscores the importance of scaling up in areas where we see development results' said Ellen Goldstein at the ceremony.

The first phase benefited an estimated 3 million people in seven of Bangladesh's poorest districts. The second phase will deepen activity in these districts and expand to eight others, reaching an additional 3 million people, the release said.

The 42 million dollar additional funding for the on-going Municipal Services Project is one response to the World Bank's strategic priority of improving planning and management of the urbanisation process in Bangladesh.

Started in 1999, the project has financed basic infrastructure, such as water supply, roads and street lighting in about 130 municipalities, and repaired and rehabilitated flood-damaged infrastructure in more than 200 towns following the devastating floods of 1998, 2004 and 2007.

The additional financing will support infrastructure improvements in around 170 towns and improve financial and management capacity in municipalities.

\$300m ADB loan for power sector

The Asian Development Bank (ADB) will provide a 300 million US dollar loan to improve efficient energy uses in power plants and support renewable energy projects.

The top officials of ADB mission assured this at a meeting on Sunday with the senior officials of the PowerDevelopmentBoard (PDB) at the PDB office.

The mission led by Priyantha Wijayathnga, ADB's Senior Energy Specialist for South Asia, also showed interest in supporting the 5 megawatt (MW) Kaptai solar power project, which will be the first power project of this kind with grid connectivity in the country.

"We are generating power with some plants those are running at 21 percent to 27 percent efficiency level, which increased our production cost as well as burning huge quantity of precious natural gas", PDB

Chairman ASM Alamgir Kabirsaid.

The power plants at Ashuganj, Raozan Shikalbaha, Ghorasal, Siddhirganj, Khulna and Barapukuria are the most inefficient plants which are producinghugeheatanditsefficiencylevelisbetween 21 percent and 32 percent, says a PDB source.

These power plants are generating 1655MW of poweralthoughits installed capacity is 2005 MW.

The ADB mission told the meeting that they are in favour of replacing the old power plants that consume huge quantity of gas, but produce small quantity of power.

"Siddhirganj and Ashuganj power plants are on the top of the list. They want to convert the Siddhirganj into combined cycle and replace the old stem turbine ingasturbine", a PDB top official said.

Through this investment, power sector could get 450MW from these plants burning the same quantity of gas.

TANHA MURDER Rajib still denies involvement STAFF CORRESPONDENT

Though Rajib, the lover of Halima Yasmin, who killed her three-and-a-half-year-old Jennifer Islam Tanha, has been arrested but did not confess to the killing.

Three persons, including the house owner of Rajib, the alleged killer of Tanha and her mother's lover, identified him in Khilgaon Police Station yesterday where Rajib is under remand.

On August 4, Khilgaon police recovered the decomposed body of Tanha from the sunshade under the window of Rajib's rented house. The baby was killed on July 29.

On the second day of the remand, Khilgaon Police Station OC Nazimuddin told The Daily Star that till yesterday Rajib denied his involvement in the killing. He even claimed that he did not know Tanha's mother HalimaYasmin.

The OC also said Halima is now in Jail. He said police yesterday appealed to the court for bringing Halima and Rajib face-to-face.
