Faulty launches getting facelift

Passengers await risky journey ahead of Eid

More than a hundred faulty and unfit launches are getting quick repair in Keraniganj dockyards to carry passengers on different routes ahead of Eid-ul-Fitr.

Most vessels have major defects in engines or design faults, said repairers in dockyards. They could not tell whether the launches have any fitness certificates.

The workers were busy refurbishing and making minor repairs on the vessels as the owners want the job completed before the Eid, the prime time for transport business.

"We are not authorised to check fitness of vessels. From our working experience, we can tell whether a vessel is fit or not. A number of unfit vessels are brought here for repair," said Zulfikar Ali, general manager of Comilla Ship Builders. Director General of Department of Shipping

Bazlur Rahman said he heard that a few launches were getting repaired in different dockyards ahead of the Eid. "We will take stern action if any unfit launch

plies during the Eid," he said. Bazlur said only three surveyors and four inspectors are there to verify fitness of over 11,308 registered vessels.

A source at the Department of Shipping said more than 23,000 unregistered vessels ply different routes across the country.

Safe Waterway Implementation Movement, a non-governmental organisation, in a survey in January said 2,082 of the 5,000 launches it covered were unregistered.

More than four million people are expected to leave the capital for the southern part by launches ahead of the Eid.

Vessel owners operate more trips during the Eid as the number of passengers shoots up during the period, said Sadarghat Port Officer Sharif Afzal.



"We decided that not a single vessel would be allowed to ply without fitness certificate."

Several hundred workers at different dockyards were seen busy repairing vessels.

"We have to work day and night before the Eid as the vessel owners are putting pressure on us to get the work finished as soon as possible," said a worker at Hossain Dockyard.

Probe focused on 3 hours after firing

Investigators in Ibrahim murder case are enquiring why it took three hours to take the victim to the hospital, and why Kala left the scene of shooting instead of accompanying the victim to the emergency department.

"We are now investigating two points -- why Ibrahim was sent to the hospital three hours late, and why Kala left the scene immediately instead of accompanying Ibrahim to the hospital," said Additional Deputy Commissioner (ADC) of DB Mohammad Moniruzzaman.

He said the victim was shot between 5:15pm and 5:35pm, but he was taken to Dhaka Medical College Hospital around 8:00pm.

"Now we will try to understand what happened in between, and the reason behind Kala's departure from the scene instead of accompanying Ibrahim to the hospital," he told

Sadeque on the same charge. On September 4, 2008, the ACC served a notice on Ishrak asking him to submit his wealth statement. The deadline for submission of the statement expired on

September 15 the same year. The first information report said the ACC served the notice as it learnt that Ishrak had amassed wealth beyond known sources of income.

FALL FROM HIGH-RISE 2 construction | Clean tech for brick kilns

Adopted in Savar kiln on trial basis; can cut air pollution by 60-70pc, save 4 lakh trees a year

A brick company using clean technology has started its debut production in the country at Nayarhat, Savar.

Vertical Shaft Brick Kiln, the technology, can reduce air pollution up to 60 to 70 percent and save 4 lakh trees every year, said Soumen Maity, an expert involved with the pilot project. It would also reduce use of coal by 30 to 40 percent, he said.

Conforce Ltd has set up the kiln with financial assistance from the World Bank and technical support from two India based NGOs -- Development Alternatives and Action for Rural Advancement. Practical Action, another NGO, is implementing the project.

Conforce Ltd got the fund through an open bidding, said WB officials. Managing Director of Conforce Ltd Nazmul Hossain said,

"We got interested in the technology since it reduces energy consumption, which ultimately cuts production cost. "We have already started marketing our bricks and will go

full-fledged within a few days," he added. The new kiln has two shafts, each capable of producing 9,000

to 10,000 bricks round the clock under close supervision. Soumen Maity, team leader of Training and Technology of

Development Alternatives, said the quality of the bricks from this kiln is as good as regular bricks." He said it costs around Tk 30 lakh to install a vertical shaft kiln

while a traditional one needs more than Tk 1 crore excluding land. Soumen is optimistic that smaller entrepreneurs would be interested in adopting the technology, as a vertical brick kiln needs smaller space.

Officials of the project said there are about 4,000 registered brick kilns in Bangladesh, which burn around 2.2 million metric tonnes of coal every year. If half of the kilns are turned into vertical shaft ones, we can save 4.8 lakh metric tonnes of coal and SEE PAGE 15 COL 2




