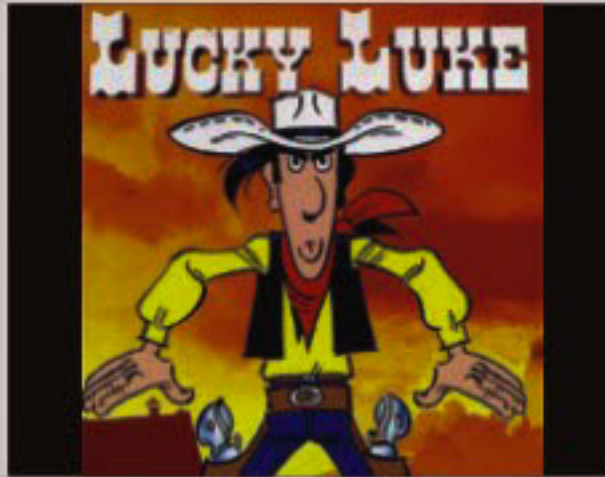

Experimenting with themes, forms and objects

A group art exhibition, featuring the works of Sanjib Saha, Mohammad Imam Hossain, Silvia Nazneen, Chandan Kumar Barman, Sonia Parvin,

Shahida Parveen, Quazi Nawshaba Ahmed and Abu Bakar Siddique, is on at Zainul Gallery, Faculty of Fine Arts (FFA), University of Dhaka. The participating painters are students of the Drawing and Painting Department of FFA.

The exhibition was inaugurated by noted theatre personality Ramendu Majumdar on September 2. Noted art critic Moynuddin Khaled and cartoonist Shishir Bhattacharjee were present as special guests.

Most of the painters in the group are regarded as social conscious artists. They are known as thinking artists whose works invite us to engage cerebrally with the images they create. At the exhibition, technique, in

some cases, seems to be more significant than subject or theme. The themes are closely related to our varied social-cultural and economical issues. The group of painters, particularly, Mohammad Imran Hossain, Sanjib Saha, Shahida Parveen, Sonia Parvin demonstrate our political instability, superstitions, inhumanity, cruelty, criminal activities, communalism and fanaticism. Distorted visages, deformed figures, twisted limbs are recurring features in this group of painters.

Quazi Nawshaba Ahmed and Sanjib Saha have a tendency to experiment with themes, forms and objects. However, nature and picturesque beauty and rural landscape are completely lacking in their works. Most of the works are conceptual based and the painters use different mediums like oil, acrylic and mixed media.

Sanjib Saha's "Effect of Technology" denotes our technique-based music and its great influence on our society. Underlying the work is the loss of our identity and the increasing distance from our traditional and classical music. As a painter, Saha feels that he has a great responsibility to focus on the current situation in our music industry. He records time and history of our music scenario.

Sonia Parvin's "Distortion-1" portrays an aged man's shouting face and a number of figures behind the face. Blue, green and white are predominant aspects in the works. As a painter, she captures underprivileged peoples' pains and agonies. Her language is distinctive as she uses the canvas to protest cruelty, inequality, political chaos, poverty and violence in our everyday life.

Quazi Nawshaba Ahmed's human forms and themes are simple and immersed in straight lines. Her paintings are noticeable for their light quality. Blue, yellow are dominant aspect in her works.

The exhibition ends on September 10.

Woo awarded Golden Lion for lifetime achievement

John Woo built his reputation with stylish Hong Kong action thrillers, then moved to Hollywood where he directed such big-budget blockbusters as "Mission Impossible II."

The director is now preparing for a third phase of his career.

"I would like to be a bridge between the good things of the West and the East, so we can further our mutual knowledge and build a strong friendship," Woo said Friday.

Woo was awarded a Golden Lion award for Lifetime Achievement at the Venice Film Festival, which recognized the director "as an innovator of the contemporary language of cinema" and for renewing action films by introducing extreme stylization.

Woo, 64, has directed more than 26 films in nearly 30 years, beginning his career in Hong Kong in the 1970s before moving to Hollywood in the 1990s. His U.S. feature debut in 1993 was "Hard Target" starring Jean-Claude Van Damme, and his first Hollywood hit was 1995's "Broken Arrow," with John Travolta and Christian Slater. "Mission Impossible II," starring Tom Cruise, grossed more than \$1 billion worldwide.

Despite his filmmaking successes, Woo said he was shocked to be given a lifetime achievement award.

"I wouldn't say that I have much contributed to film society, even though I made several good films," Woo said.

Venice Film Festival director Marco Mueller, an Asian film expert, said Woo's films are "a perfect union of the China tradition and avant-garde filmmaking."

"I don't think we are bestowing an honor. I think it was here waiting for him," Mueller said.

Woo more recently has returned to Chinese filmmaking, directing the epic period war drama "Red Cliff," based on a war that took place in China in the 3rd Century.

Woo said it was about time to bring everything he learned over 16 years working in Hollywood, back to China.

"Right now, I am very happy to be making movies in China for various reasons, because we have a very old history and also a popular

folklore that is different from what is known in abroad. I would like to work on films in the future that are more Chinese in nature, but without leaving Hollywood behind," Woo said.

Woo said he chose to make a historic drama like "Red Cliff" to try to help the world learn more about China.

"I have worked a lot abroad, and I find people in general don't know much about our history. People only know Kung-fu films," Woo said.

That's not to say he has left action films behind. He was presenting in Venice a new epic martial arts thriller, "Reign of Assassins," starring Michelle Yeoh, showing out of competition.

This was Woo's fourth time in Venice. He was the "godfather" of a section on Asian film in 2004, directed "All Invisible Children," which showed out of competition in 2006, and was the producer of "Blood Brothers," which showed in 2007.

Gone With The Wind actress dies

Former Gone With The Wind child actress Cammie King Conlon - who played the doomed daughter of Scarlett O'Hara and Rhett Butler - has died aged 76.

She died of lung cancer on Wednesday with her son, Matthew Ned Conlon, by her side, her friend Bruce Lewis said.

She appeared in the 1939 film at five. The death of her character, Bonnie Blue Butler, causes irreparable damage to Scarlett and Rhett's marriage.

Three years later, she voiced young doe Faline in Walt Disney's Bambi.

Speaking to the Santa Rosa Press Democrat newspaper about Gone With The Wind last year, she said: "As the years have gone by, I realise it's an honour and it's so humbling."

"I had nothing to do with it - I was five. They said, 'stand here, do this'. And yet it's resulted in this incredible experience."

She went on to work as a director of a museum and as a publicist for a chamber of commerce.
