Fast-track energy deals for 2 years

Govt okays draft law for unsolicited tender

The cabinet yesterday approved a draft law that would allow the government to award energy sector contracts on unsolicited negotiation basis on a short notice for next two years.

The draft of the Power and Energy Fast Supply Enhancement (Special Provision) Law, 2010 comes with 14 clauses that cover procurement approval.

If parliament approves it to make it a law, this would be applied for the tenders for large-scale power projects and a Liquefied Natural Gas (LNG) terminal. These projects are worth several billion US dollars.

According to the summary on the draft submitted to the cabinet by the Power Division of the energy ministry, the whole process from project planning to the law would allow tendering authori-

ties to quickly publish tender notices on newspapers and websites, make correspondences and negotiations with bidders through emails to fix service

"This will give tendering authorities like the Power Development Board [PDB] exemption from time bindings for holding a tender dictated by the concerned laws so that the government can quickly

SPREAD OF ANTHRAX Govt asks people not to panic

Cabinet okays new industrial policy

In an apparent shift from the existing industrial policy, the government in its new plan has put stress on strengthening state-owned enterprises to both supplement and compete with the private sector.

The existing policy lays emphasis on privatisation and denationalisation of state-

owned-enterprises (SOEs). The cabinet approved the new Industrial Policy 2010 at a meeting with Prime Minister

Sheikh Hasina in the chair yesterday. Economists say creation of alternative employment for retrenched workers is a good initiative. But generation of jobs will be hindered if the SOEs are not pulled out of losses.
