Half the nation remains illiterate for poor planning, allocation, project-oriented approach; govt still eyes total literacy by 2014

Inadequate budgetary allocations for education, poor planning and irregularities have left almost half the country's population illiterate although governments in the last 39 years talked about giving utmost priority to the

The country marks this year's literacy day through events on the theme "Literacy and women's empowerment".

When Bangladesh became independent in 1971, the literacy rate was abysmal, 16.8 percent. Ever since, successive governments have allocated the highest budget to this sector but failed to bring any significant results.

A schoolgirl in Satkhira yesterday killed herself by taking poison reportedly after failing to bear the brunt of stalking. In Chapainawabganj a man was beaten to death by stalkers as he protested teasing of his colleague's wife and daughter.

The deceased girl, Chameli Khatun, 14, daughter of Shafiqul Islam of Manderbaria village at Koira upazila, Khulna, was residing at her maternal uncle's house here at Rajarbagan, reports our Satkhira correspondent.

She was a student of Pallimongal High School in Satkhira town.

Wholesale pardon under question

14 out of 20 death convicts in Gama killing case step out of jail; president's mercy draws mixed reaction

The law ministry had recommended President Zillur Rahman to grant clemency to the 20 death row inmates convicted in the Gama killing case.

Fourteen of the 20 convicts were released from Dhaka and Rajshahi central jails early yesterday. Six were not released as they have other charges against them, said jail officials.

The ministry made the recommendation after scrutinising the court's verdict, evidence and documents. It also considered the convicts' age and financial condition of their fami-

> Home Secretary Abdus Sobhan Sikder said according to Article-49 of the constitution, the president has absolute power to grant mercy to any convict.

> The article said, "The president shall have power to grant pardons, reprieves and respites and to remit, suspend or commute and sentence passed by any court, tribunal or other


