Fugitive killer arrested

Police arrested an absconding accused in six-year-old Shuva murder case on Tuesday night. The arrestee is Md Mizanur Rahman, 36, son of Bachchu Mistri of village Bewla under Satkhira Sadar upazila. Acting on a tip-off, police arrested Mizan at a house at Shovnali village in Assassuni upazila. Shuva, son of Billal Hossain of Bakra village in the same upazila, was abducted on June 15 this year. His body was found on the char of the Marichchap River near Bangdah in the upazila the following day. Victim's father Billal Hossain filed a case with Assassuni Police Station the same day, accusing Mizan.

15 hurt as villagers clash

At least 15 people were injured as the people of two villages in Chatmohar upazila clashed over a trivial matter yesterday. Police and locals said the trouble began following an altercation between Mujibur Rahman of Hasapur village and Kashem member of Pankura village at Handial Bazar over return of money that Mujibur had earlier borrowed from Kashem. Later, the people of the two villages, equipped with lethal weapons attacked each other, leaving 15 people from both sides injured. Of the injured, Rabiul, 35, Mujibar, 38, Razzak, 45, Amjad, 42, Moniruzaman, 35, Jahangir, 36, Kashem, 45, Tofez, 40, Shihab, 25, and Monir, 28, were admitted to Chatmohar Upazila Health Complex while the rest given first aid.

Extortionist held with arms

Rapid Action Battalion (Rab) members arrested an extortionist with firearms at Hazratpur Dhalikandi village under Keraniganj Model Police Station early yesterday. The arrestee is Jasim Uddin Bhuiyan alias Jasim, 35, son of Nur Mohammad Bhuiyan of the village. A team of Rab-10 raided the village at around 3:00am and arrested Jasim at his house. He also recovered a 9mm pistol and bullets from his possession. Rab sources said Jasim had been extorting money from the owners of sand carrying vessels and brickfields at gunpoint in the area for long.

Workers agitate for bonus

The workers of Talukder Pipe and Plastic at Rajerhat on the outskirts of Jessore town vandalised the unit and set fire to it on Monday evening as the authorities did not pay heed to their demand for Eid bonus. On information, fire fighters from the district town rushed to the spot and extinguished the blaze. Sources said the workers of the industry have been demanding Eid bonus for the last 15 days. As the authorities refused to give them bonus in the morning, they went on the rampage.

Road barricaded protesting power outage

Power hungry people barricaded Panchagarh-Dhaka highway yesterday afternoon for about three hours at Dhakkamara village under Sadar upazila in Panchagarh.

During the barricade from 2.00pm to 5.00pm, a large number of vehicles remained stranded on both sides of the road causing immense sufferings to the inter-district passengers.

Villagers told the reporters that power supply to the area (Dakkamara village) remained cut off from Sunday as a transformer went out of order.

Thousands of families and business establishments are suffering for lack of power supply, they said.

Despite several reminders to power officials everyday, they didn't take effective steps to resume power supply, the villagers alleged.

On information, Deputy Commissioner of Panchagarh Banamali Bhoumick rushed to the spot and assured people of resuming power supply to the area as soon as possible.

After the assurance, people withdrew the barricade at about 5.00pm.

Contacted, Resident Engineer of Panchagarh PDB Mohammad Tajul Islam told this correspondent that they were trying to restore power supply by replacing the transformer.

Housewife killed, another allegedly commits suicide

A housewife was killed while another allegedly committed suicide on Monday and the day before in Magura and Sherpur district.

A housewife was killed allegedly by her husband for dowry at Abalpur village in sadar upazila of Magura on Monday night, reports UNB.

The deceased was identified as Eti Khatun, 23, wife of Kafur Mollah of the village.

Police and family sources said Eti Khatun got married with Kafur Mollah four years back. Kafur used to torture her physically and mentally for dowry money.

Kafur beat Eti to death at one stage of brawl on the fateful night. He hanged the body with the beam of his house to hide the real incident, neighbours said.

On information, police recovered the body at noon on Monday and sent to hospital morgue for autopsy.

Kafur went into hiding soon after the incident.

In Sherpur, a housewife committed suicide by hanging herself due to abject poverty at Chithlia village in Nokla upazila on Sunday late night.

The deceased was identified as Mamtaj Begum, 40, wife of Kitab Ali of the same village.

Mamtaj used to lock into altercation with her husband as he could not arrange marriage for their two daughters.

Police and neighbours said the couple locked in an altercation on Sunday night as Kitab could not buy dress for their two daughters ahead of Eid.

Mamtaj Begum committed suicide by hanging herself with the beam of the house after taking shehri early Monday.

DEATHS AFTER VACCINATION IN BARISAL

Police yet to get court order to submit probe report

Hizla police in Barisal are yet to receive the court order asking them to submit the probe reports on the deaths of three infants within hours after being injected with measles vaccine.

Mrittunjoy Mistri, senior judicial magistrate of Barisal, on Monday ordered the officer-in-charge of Hizla Police Station to submit the investigation reports following three separate cases filed

by the fathers of the deceased.

The deceased, each aged about 10 months, are Toma, Tisha and Pranto of Kalikapur village under Hizla upazila.

Earlier on Monday, Profulla Dhali, father of Toma; Pancho Kolu, father of Tisha; and Anil Kolu, father of Pranto filed the cases with the magistrate's court.

After the hearing, the court took the charges into

cognisance and asked the police to submit the investigation reports in the three cases on September 11, 12 and 13 respectively.

However, Rafikul Hossain, officer-in-charge of Hizla Police Station, told The Daily Star yesterday he is unaware of the cases filed and also the court order.

He said police will take necessary actions after getting the court order. Police earlier recorded cases of three unnatural deaths in this

connection.

Taslima Parvin, health assistant of Kalikapur Community Health Clinic where the three babies were vaccinated under Expanded Programme of Immunisation (EPI), and health worker Md Syed Jawed Shahin of the clinic are accused in all the three cases.

Taslima Parvin was unavailable for comments, as her mobile phone was found switched off.

Young man murdered

A young man was stabbed to death by his neighbours over a trifling matter at Brahmanbaria in Raiganj upazila on Sunday.

The deceased was identified as Shahin, 27, son of Mizanur Rahman of same village.

Police said Shahin was smoking at a bazaar at the village openly during daytime in holy month of Ramadan at about 5:30pm on Saturday.

Seeing this, his neighbour Nazrul Islam, son of Nurul Islam, protested the open smoking, which resulted in an altercation between them.

At one stage, Nazrul hit Shahin with a sharp weapon, leaving him injured.

Injured Shahin was rushed to Sadar Hospital and later shifted to Rajshahi Medical College Hospital where he died at noon Sunday.

5 shops, 12 houses gutted in 2 districts

Five shops and 12 houses were gutted in two incidents of fire on Wednesday in Habiganj and Lalmonirhat districts.

Five shops were gutted in a fierce fire at Katiadi Bazaar in Bahubal upazila of Habiganj Wednesday afternoon, reports our staff correspondent in Sylhet.

Locals said, the fire originated from the electrical shop of one Jalil Miah at about 1:30pm and soon spread to the adjacent shops.

Fire service personnel from Habiganj rushed to the bazaar and brought the situation under control with the help of local people.

In Lalmonirhat, at least 12 dwelling houses were gutted at Khodhagach village in Sadar upazila on Wednesday night.

Local people said the fire originated from the kitchen of one Khoka Mia and soon engulfed the nearby houses, reports UNB.

On information, fire service personnel from the district town rushed in and put out the blaze with the help of local people.

DAULATDIA-PATURIA RIVER ROUTE Movement of goods-laden trucks banned during Eid holidays

Movement of goods-laden trucks through the Daulatdia-Paturia river route will remain prohibited for several days apparently to avoid traffic jam at the terminals during and after Eid holidays.

However, the trucks carrying perishable goods will not come under the purview of the restriction.

The restriction will take effect from today.

The measures aimed at removing traffic jam at the ghats and ensuring smooth journey of home-bound people through the route.

Shipping Minister Shajahan Khan told this to journalists at Paturia ghat after visiting the Daulatdia and Patuaria ghats yesterday.

The minister said that necessary steps were taken to

check all kinds of criminal activities in two ghats.

The minister visited two ghats to see the situation there. He also talked to launch owners and passengers.

He directed local administration, including BIWTC, to take necessary measures so that people could cross the river route smoothly and safely.
