"They misunderstood our intentions as we temporarily kept them in the underground room," he said.

Of the 76 cases, 66 are from Kisamot Harati village under sadar upazila and 10 from Kaliganj upazila, reports our Lalmonirhat correspondent.

A medical team has already collected the specimen of blood and skin from the affected people and sent those to the capital for diagnosis, said Dr Jahangir Alam, civil surgeon of the district.

Authorities of the Institute of Epidemiology, Disease Control and Research (IEDCR) confirmed 337 human cases of anthrax on Monday.

Though anthrax is not new in the country, this year a significant number of people at different districts are affected with the infection.

"Especially, before the Eid festival a large number of cattle are transported from different areas without proper screening. Perhaps, new cattle from different districts and even from India were affected with the disease, which later spread among the people due to direct contact," said Dr Abdul Baki, director of animal health of the livestock depart-

A total of 19 cows and 43 goats were reported to have died of anthrax over the last few months, he said.

But no case of human death from the disease has been reported till now, as treatment for anthrax is available in the country, he added.

Against this backdrop, the government is launching two mega projects Basic Literacy and Continuing Education (BLCE) project-1 and 2 at a cost of around Tk 3,000 crore to fulfil its election pledge of eradicating illiteracy. The Bureau of Non-Formal Education (BNFE) under the primary and mass education ministry will implement the projects.

BNFE sources said the projects aim at providing basic and life-skills based education to the people who never enrolled in or dropped out from primary schools.

The BLCE-1 would be implemented in 61 districts with Tk 2,912 crore while the BLCE-2 in three hilly districts at a cost of Tk 50 crore. Educationists, however,

are quite sceptical about achieving the target by 2014 through these projects. They cited the example of failure of a previous similar project (TLM). The TLM was introduced

in 1996 by the then Awami League government, but the BNP government cancelled in 2003 bringing allegations of irregularities and misman-State Minister for primary

In Brussels, a Nato official said Monday that alliance commander Gen David Petraeus had asked for 2,000 more soldiers, with nearly half to be trainers for the rapidly expanding Afghan security forces. The Nato official requested anonymity because he was not authorized to

speak on the subject. The training mission document outlines large-scale infrastructure projects, including a military hospital and military and police academies, aimed at "establishing enduring institutions" and "creating irreversible momen-
