Open final since Maria Bueno of Brazil defeated Carole Caldwell Graebner of the United States 6-1, 6-0 in 1964. "A little bit of experience definitely helps,"

she said. "It's tough [for Zvonareva], but it took me six or seven finals until I finally got one."

A distraught-looking Zvonareva said simply:

joined on the Arthur Ashe Stadium court after the prize-award ceremony by two-and-a-half year-old daughter Jada and basketball-playing husband Brian Lynch.
