Nadal comes full circle

Grand Slam title sweep on Monday by capturing his first US Open crown, defeating Serbian third seed

Novak Djokovic 6-4, 5-7, 6-4, 6-2. The 24-year-old Spanish left-hander overwhelmed Djokovic with uncanny shotmaking

to win the 1.7 million-dollar top prize as well as his third consecutive Grand Slam crown and his ninth Grand Slam title overall. Nadal became the seventh man to complete

a career Grand Slam sweep, joining Roger Federer, Andre Agassi, Roy Emerson, Rod Laver, Don Budge and Fred Perry in having won Wimbledon and the US, French and Australian Open titles.

"That's more than what I dreamt," Nadal said. "Just to be in this final was amazing."

Showers pushed the final to Monday for the third year in a row and halted the match for one hour and 48 minutes, but rain only delayed Nadal's reign on the Flushing Meadows hardcourts despite losing his lone set of the fortnight.

"To have the trophy right here in my hands in a few seconds is going to be unbelievable," Nadal said at the on-court award ceremony. Seconds later, he was smiling and hoisting the

trophy above his head.

A ninth Slam title moved Nadal alone into World number one Rafael seventh on the all-time list, passing Agassi, Perry, Nadal completed a career Ken Rosewall and Ivan Lendl and moving only seven shy of Federer's all-time record, three crowns ahead of Federer's Slam-title pace.

"Right now he's the best player in the world and he absolutely deserves this title," Djokovic

After winning Wimbledon and the French Open earlier this year, Nadal joined Federer, Laver and Pete Sampras as the only men to win three Slams in a row in the Open Era that began in 1968.

Nadal, third-youngest on the Slam sweep list, would join Laver and Budge as the only men to hold all four Slam crowns at once by winning the 2011 Australian Open.

No Spanish man had won the US Open title since Manuel Orantes in 1975 and the only other Spanish US Open champion was Manuel Santana in 1965. Not since John McEnroe in 1984 had a left-hander had won the US Open men's title.

Nadal was broken only five times in the tournament, matching the mark for fewest broken serves by a US Open men's champion set by Andy Roddick in 2003.

Djokovic, whose lone Grand Slam title came at the 2008 Australian Open, had won his three

Shakib Al Hasan confessed that he had no qualms of being lonely in the West Midlands of England.

"I am enjoying my time so much that I don't feel homesick," said all-rounder Shakib Al Hasan while talking with the Daily Star Sport over phone yesterday, moments before he left home for the second day's play against Sussex at the New Road ground.

"Before this time, I had once enjoyed Eid abroad but that was with teammates. But this time it was something new for me. But honestly speaking I didn't feel bad though I thought that it would be hard for me to stay without my family for more than a month," said Shakib, who will return home on September 18 to join the training camp to prepare for the next month's one-day series against New Zealand.

It was altogether a different Eid celebration for the Bangladesh all-rounder, who already made his mark in County Cricket, as he had a game on Eid day at Lord's.

Shakib performed his Eid prayers at the Regents Park Mosque and then played the game against Middlesex where he took a career-best 7 for 32 to earn a stunning victory for Worcestershire. After the game he joined an Eid party at St. Peters College and then had dinner with a Bangladeshi family in London.

"Actually I enjoyed the day. So far I have had hardly any leisure time besides cricket. I am enjoying every bit of it here as everything is new to me.

"I am playing cricket in a totally different atmosphere. The reaction was as usual even after my seven-wicket haul," informed Shakib.

He also said that the supporters want him to continue his stint with Worcestershire in the next season also. "This is great feeling as the supporters want me to continue with my team for next season also," he said, adding, "I learnt many things by playing county cricket but it must reflected in my performance while playing for the national team. I have to prove that my county experiences matured me. Ultimately performance is the key for any player," said Shakib.

The immediate-past Bangladesh skipper believed that his performance in England's domestic game will open a window for other Bangladeshi players.

"Definitely it's open a window but once again performance is the key. I think Tamim (Iqbal) has every chance to play county cricket next year because he is now our No 1 performer," he

"You can't replace him with any other player right at the moment. So, we will feel his absence during the five-match oneday series against New Zealand," opined Shakib.

The all-rounder has learned many things as a cricketer by playing county cricket but as a cook he became skilled at only two recipes. "I can make only omelette and fried eggs."

three years from 2005, as well as assistant head coach to the Netherlands, helping take the Dutch to the 2007 ICC World Cup in the West Indies. Before 2009, he also worked as ECB The 49-year-old Englishman will arrive in National Skill Sets Coach, specialist coach to

the Worcestershire Academy, and invited coach of Nashua Dolphins provincial team in South Africa and the MRF Pace Academy in Chennai. He has also had stints with Warwickshire and Kent. Currently, Pont is head coach to the International Cricket Camp in Potchefstroom, which takes place each December.

He has also been a fast bowling coach to the professional squad and academy at

Northamptonshire since 2008. Pont predominantly played for Essex but also had stints in

Nottinghamshire and Natal. He took 70 first-class wickets in 28 games between 1982 and 1988 including five-wicket hauls in his debut and final first-class games.
