According to experts anthrax is an infectious disease caused by bacteria called Bacillus anthracis. Infection in humans most often involves the skin, the gastrointestinal tract or the lungs.

Anthrax commonly affects hoofed animals such as cow, sheep and goats, but humans who come into contact with the infected animals can get sick from anthrax, they said.

Anthrax was first detected in Sirajganj on August 20 this year and then it spread to 1 other districts including Pabna, Tangail, Kushtia and Meherpur and Panchagarh.

At least 523 people have reportedly been affected by anthrax across the country while at least 43 animals died of anthrax as of Thursday.
