Noman seeks Tk 2,000cr budgetary funds for Ctg

BNP Vice-chairman Abdullah Al Noman here yesterday demanded special block allocation of Tk 2,000 crore in budget for the greater development of Chittagong.

He urged all, irrespective of political affiliations, to launch agitation for infrastructure development and enhancement of the capacity of Chittagong Port to accelerate the country's economic growth.

He said the present government has taken no single development project for Chittagong in the last one year and nine months.

Noman criticised Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina for terming the four projects, she inaugurated on September 8, "Eid gifts to Chittagong people".

All the projects were initiated and mostly implemented during the tenure of last fourparty government, claimed Noman.

He was addressing a view exchange meeting with journalists at a local restaurant in the afternoon.

Noman pointed out different development projects he undertook as a minister during the two terms of BNP government since 1991.

He said the allegation of local Awami League leaders that BNP did nothing is false.

He said projects like the 3rd Karnaphuli Bridge, new Chittagong courthouse and Karnaphuli Gas Distribution Company Ltd were initiated and mostly implemented by BNP led 4-party government.

Terming the country's current political and economic situation "unstable", Noman urged to launch mass movement against the AL-led government.

In a reply, he said the intra-party conflict in Chittagong BNP is a 'difference of opinion' not unusual in a large political party.

Such "differences" would not block the way for anti-government movement, Noman observed.

BNP city unit General Secretary Dr Shahadat Hossain, BNP central committee member Mahmubul Hoque Shamim, BNP leaders MA Sabur, Sheikh Md Mohiuddin, Aslam Chowdhury, Jubo Dal leaders Anwar Hossain, Abul Hashem Bakkar, Sramik Dal leader Sheikh Nurullah Bahar, among others, were present at the meeting.

A mobile court yesterday fined 17 traders at Mirpur and Kachukhet in the capital a total of around Tk one lakh instantly for illegally selling and storing polythene bags, says a press release. The court also filed cases against the traders on the same

During the drive, officials also distributed anti-polythene leaflets and attached stickers on the area.

Dhaka district's Executive Magistrate Roni Chakma conducted the mobile court accompanied by police and DoE officials. The drive was being conducted as part of an on-going one-

week drive against use of banned polythene. Starting on last Sunday, the weeklong drive ends today.

17 polythene traders | UK assures support for disaster-hit people

The UK assured Bangladesh of assistance in rebuilding coastal embankments and constructing cyclone shelter centres to help save people from natural disasters. This pledge came when Food and Disaster

Management Minister Abdur Razzaque met British Minister of State for International Development Alan Duncan at his office in England on Tuesday.

Razzaque told the UK minister that Bangladesh has been a disaster-prone country and climate change has hugely increased the risks by putting people in danger, says a food ministry press release. He said since the cyclone Aila that devastated

the country's southwestern districts last year, the coastal embankments remain vulnerable.

But those could not be strengthened or increased in height due to financial constraints, he added.

Besides, 2000 cyclone shelter centres in the coastal areas are not adequate, he said, adding that international aid agencies like the Department for International Development (DFID) of UK should come forward on this regard.

In response, Alan Duncan said DFID has already taken a good number of projects to increase the living standards of the low-income people.

He said the issue of rebuilding coastal embankments was not in his knowledge.

He added that he would allocate money, in the next budget of the DFID, for the rebuilding of embankments and setting up new cyclone shelters.

BARAPUKURIA Affected people to get compensation

The government yesterday decided to give cash compensation directly to the affected people of Barapukuria coal mine as per their demand.

"We have decided to give cash money to the affected people of Barapukuria coal mine area directly", M Mizbahuddin, secretary of the energy division told the news

He said the decision was taken following a week long meeting with the affected families of Barapukuria coal mine area.

It was also decided to establish a coalmine city at Dinajpur district to start coal extraction from Barapukuria and Phulbari coal mine soon.

The government earlier formed a high-powered committee to look into the interest of the people affected by landslide at Barapukuraia coalmine area.

The committee members visited the affected areas recently, to assess the situation and they also discussed with the local people about the compensation, a senior official of the energy ministry

Dr Tawfiq-e-Elahi Chowdhury, the adviser to the prime minister chaired a meeting at energy division yesterday to discuss the Barapukuria issue.

Enamul Haque, the state minister for Power, Energy and Mineral Resources, Mostafizur Rahman, the state minister for Land, Energy Secretary M. Mizbahuddin and officials concerned were oresent.

The government has allocated a Tk 265 crore compensation package for 1320 affected families of Barapukuria.

According to the energy ministry, families in the seven villages including Kalupara, Barapukuria (partially), Bashpukur (partially), Jigagari, Moupukur and Balram were badly affected during the landslide in January last.

The energy ministry sources said the government will acquire 490 acre of land of the mining areas to establish the proposed coalmine city.

According to the Petrobangla the Barapukuria coalfield has a reserve of around 389 million tonnes of coal.

GAZIPUR BLAST Death toll rises to four

Another victim of an explosion at a ceramic factory in Gazipur succumbed to his injuries at Dhaka Medical College Hospital (DMCH) yesterday raising the death toll to four.

Akkas Ali died at DMCH Burn unit at around 10:00pm. Selim Miah and Abdul Haque were fighting for their

lives at the burn unit, said DMCH sources. Samanta Lal Sen, project director of DMCH Burn and Plastic surgery unit, said the

two were in critical condition

with more than 50 percent of their bodies burnt. Sen told The Daily Star that intake of burn patients from different industrial areas including Dhaka and adjoining areas have increased in

recent times. He said accidents could be brought down if awareness among factory owners and workers increased and the government tightened monitoring.

CLASH WITH DMCH EMPLOYEES, HAWKERS

Case filed against DU students, staff

A hawker yesterday filed a case with Shahbagh police in connection with Tuesday's clash between students and employees of Dhaka University's Shahidullah Hall and Dhaka Medical College Hospital employees and hawkers.

Officer-in-Charge (OC) of Shahbagh Police Station Rezaul Karim said the hawker, Jibon, whose shop was ransacked and allegedly looted during the clash in front of DMCH emergency gate, filed the case against four employees of Shahidullah Hall by name and 40 to 50 unidentified students and employees of the hall.

At least five people were injured in the clash.

The students set fire to around 25 shops and vandalised a number of makeshift shops on the footpath in front of the DMCH at around 10:30pm on Tuesday, police said.

Students of Shahidullah Hall said the children of the DMCH employees and hawkers peddle cannabis and use drugs at the hall premises and the adjoining areas. Yesterday they beat a child of a hall employee that led to the clash. Meanwhile, home minis-

ter, state minister for home and Dhaka metropolitan police commissioner visited DMCH yesterday noon to see a police constable who received bullet injuries during the

Replying to the journalists' queries the minister and state

minister for home said whoever was responsible for the incident

will be brought to book.

Hawkers and employees alleged that the criminals in a planned way yesterday made the attack for looting the shops. They demanded arrest of the miscreants and their trial.

Abul Kalam, an employee of Jibon's shop said the attackers looted six mobile phone sets, cashTk7,000 and other items.

Provost of Shahidullah Hall, Professor Azizur Rahman, told reporters Tuesday night that a threemember enquiry committee has been formed to probe into the incident.
