

The building of toxic fume tragedy in Madhya Kunipara. The ground floor housed a dyeing factory while the top five floors "accommodated" around 1,200 people.


Six-storey hazard

1,200 live on floors above dyeing factory; owner asked to start demolishing the building immediately

The Rajdhani Unnayan Kartripakkha (Rajuk) yesterday directed the owner of the six-storey factory-cum-residential building in Tejgaon industrial area to dismantle the structure immediately.

On Wednesday, at least 50 people of the building fell sick after inhaling toxic fumes from a dyeing factory housed on the ground floor. The hazardous struc-



ture--mostly made of wood and corrugated iron sheets--is home to more than 1,200 people.

Rajuk official Shafiqul Islam yesterday filed a case against building owner Md Jahiruddin and served him a notice to demolish the structure immediately.

Preface delays education policy

Four months into the cabinet's approval of the National Education Policy, the government has yet to make a visible move to implement it.

The delay is primarily caused by Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina who wanted to write a preface on the policy and took the last three months to write it, education ministry sources

To implement the country's first-ever education policy, the education ministry on June 28 this year formed a high-powered national committee headed by the education minister, but the committee could not hold a single meeting.

The policy is yet to be published on gazette due to the delay in writing the preface, and, for the same reason, the committee could not hold any meeting as the members were not distributed the copy of the policy, the sources said in return for anonymity.

However, it was finally sent back to the ministry with the premier's preface early this week, they added.

"We'll start implementing the policy after it's published in the gazette. The process to publish it is on. The policy will then be uploaded on the education ministry's website within a week or two," Education Minister Nurul Islam Nahid told The Daily Star on Monday.

The policy will also be placed at the current session of the parliament for discussion, he

The delay in implementation, however, creates concern among teachers and guardians who fear the policy might witness the same fate like the previous ones.
