# Locals pull for Pabna admin

Lawmaker questions DC's holding meeting; BCL expels 4 for attack on recruitment exam centres

Professionals and politicians irrespective of political affiliation yesterday rallied behind the Pabna district administration demanding exemplary punishment of those who assaulted government officials here last Friday.

At a view exchange meeting at the deputy commissioner's (DC) office, they also vowed to resist the attackers, and expressed disappointment that Awami League high-ups have failed to resolve the issue. Terming the attack disgraceful, they alleged

a group of criminals created a "reign of terror" in the district and "held them hostage" for

The district administration held the meeting to discuss last Friday's untoward incident,

DC AFM Monjur Kadir and other administration officials present at the meeting laid before the elite the hurdles put in their way to carry out their duties.

More than 100 Jubo League and Bangladesh Chhatra League activists attacked two examination centres during a recruitment test of class-III government employees, as the DC refused to entertain various demands of Awami League MP Golam Faruk Prince. The attackers also vandalised a number of officers' vehicles.

"I've seen many terrorist activities in Pabna, but the attack on government officials is a new experience to me," said 75-year-old Ranesh Moitra, known to be a language hero in the district.

### Fighter jet crashes in Karnaphuli

No casualties

A fighter jet of Bangladesh Air Force (BAF) crashed into the river Karnaphuli while its pilot escaped unhurt near the Patenga Boat Club here yesterday afternoon.

The pilot Flight Lieutenant Ahmed Sanjid, the only person on board the routine training flight, ejected from the jet with a parachute and fell in the river. He was taken to Combined Military Hospital (CMH) after the local boatmen rescued him.

He was in good health and was kept under observation.

The F-7 fighter crashed around 2:10pm, 10 minutes after taking off from Sergeant Zahirul Haq Airbase at Patenga, sources said.

The fighter jet crashed with a big bang and plunged into the river, Karnaphuli Police

# Businesses seek one more month

Response poor as Sept 30 deadline nears

The number of income tax returns submitted totalled 1.1 lakh yesterday with only seven days left for the deadline, National Board of Revenue sources said.

The rate of submission of tax returns is very poor this year, they mentioned.

A total of 7.57 lakh people submitted tax returns last year.

The time-limit for submission of tax returns is September 30.

And Finance Minister AMA Muhith said recently it will not be extended.

Meanwhile, chamber leaders have already asked for shifting the deadline by at least one month.

NBR officials noted that as the time-limit was extended every year in the past, many of SEE PAGE 15 COL 7 | the taxpayers have not yet submitted their

This year the NBR has initiated a massive campaign to motivate people to pay taxes in time, and will hold a four- day income tax fair from September 26. As a result, the number of taxpayers this time will be more than last year's, officials hoped.

Dhaka Chamber of Commerce and Industry yesterday wrote a letter to the NBR chairman seeking extension of the time for submission of tax returns by one month.

Contacted, DCCI President Abul Kasem Khan said due to Ramadan and Eid holidays, businessmen could not make preparations for paying income tax by September 30.

He also referred to the mindset created by extension of the time-limit every year.

Kasem hoped that the NBR would positively respond to their request.

Authorities demolish makeshift structures on Buriganga

Dhaka district administration and Bangladesh Inland Water Transport Authority (BIWTA) yesterday evicted around 85 encroachers from the river Buriganga. They demolished makeshift structures, mostly semi-

concrete, made at Swarighat in the city's Lalbagh area as grocery and fruit shops, storehouse, office of business association and fish-landing place. Sharif Afzal Hossain, Dhaka river port officer of BIWTA, said

they made a list of 208 illegal structures to be removed from the area. The drive is part of the ongoing attempt to free the river from encroachment and pollution. He also mentioned that the eviction team during

Wednesday's drive pulled down 70 structures of river grabbers.

About obstacles the team faced during the drive, Muhammad Kamruzzaman, executive magistrate of Dhaka district administration and head of the team, said a group of people began pelting the team members with brickbats as they moved to knock down a warehouse of a flourmill.
