

Asian markets mixed on recovery fears

Asian stock markets were mixed on Friday as a series of poor data out of Europe and the United States raised concerns over the global recovery.

Of Americans asking for unemployment benefits more than expected last week, ending a four-week decline. Claims for the week to September 18 hit 465,000, worse than most forecasts of 450,000 new claims.
