Culture of secrecy still big barrier to RTI law

One of the major challenges in implementing the Right to Information Act 2009 is the mindset of bureaucrats who are not yet open to the idea of providing information, said speakers at a roundtable yesterday.

They pointed out that the RTI act overrides some outdated legislations, such as the Official Secrets Act 1923, Evidence Act 1872, Rules of Business 1996 and the Government Servants (Conduct) Rules 1979. However, the

The Taliban have warned Bangladesh against sending troops to Afghanistan.

The warning came after the US requested Dhaka to send combat forces to help the coalition forces in the warravaged country, reports AFP quoting the SITE intelligence group, a US monitoring service dedicated to gathering information on international terrorist groups.

The SITE website on Monday published a report headlined "Afghan Taliban reacts to US requesting troops from Bangladesh".

He said Bangladeshi troops could help ensure security and stability in the wartorn Afghanistan.

Moni assured the US envoy of further talks on the issue.

SITE said the Taliban have responded by posting messages in Arabic and Pashto on its website and Jihadi forums calling on Dhaka to spurn the US request, reports

"(We) believe that the leader of Bangladesh has enough Islamic knowledge and political wit not to involve his [Sic] people in the fight against Islam and against the Afghan people by sending a few hundred soldiers to Afghanistan," the

"Assuming that the leader would commit such a historic mistake, the religious Muslim people of Bangladesh will not allow their leaders to assist the eternal enemy of Islam against an Islamic neighbouring country."

Despite several attempts yesterday, The Daily Star could not reach Dipu Moni in New York for comments.

In Dhaka, political leaders and eminent citizens said it does not matter if the Taliban warn or not, Bangladesh should not send troops to Afghanistan, as it is a sensitive issue involving the country's national interest.

Caretaker govt system to stay

Hasina tells press in New York

UNB, New York

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina has said her government has so far no plan to scrap the caretaker government system.

"We did not think about it," she told a 'meet the press' interaction at Bangladesh Permanent Mission Monday evening at the end of her nine-day visit to USA to attend the 65th UN General Assembly in New York.

Hasina, however, said everything would depend on the desire of the people.

The premier said a parliamentary committee, was constituted a few months ago, to suggest constitutional amendments in line with the two landmark judgments of the Supreme Court: declaring the post-75 military regimes illegal. She said the committee might have its own observations about the caretaker : Hasina on system.

She made the plea during a meeting with the UN secretary general on Monday afternoon at the UN building in New York.



Pabna DC, SP, UNO withdrawn 33 AL men charged over attack on recruitment centre

The government yesterday withdrew the deputy commissioner, superintendent of police and the upazila nirbahi officer of Pabna following the recent row between the local administrations and ruling Awami League adherents.

The ministries of establishment and home separately made the decision upon

directives from government high-ups who were irked by the role of DC AFM Manjur Kadir, SP Jamil Ahmed and UNO Abdul Halim, according to highly placed sources at the Prime Minister's Office.

DC Manjur Kadir has been posted as an OSD under the establishment ministry A new SP would soon be appointed there, while SP Jamil attached to the police

headquarters. Sources said the decision has been taken in an effort to ease the feud between the ruling party and the top district administration in Pabna.

"We have withdrawn the SP on administration grounds," Home Secretary Abdus Sobhan Sikder told The Daily Star. he said, hinting that more changes might occur in Pabna police.
