Ruling Awami League (AL) yesterday expressed concern over the security of Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina's life, as the enemies at home and abroad have been conspiring to assassinate her to hinder the trial of war criminals and culprits of August 21 grenade attack and 10 trucks arms smuggling.

AL Acting President Syeda Sajeda Chowdhury and General Secretary Syed Ashraful Islam expressed their concerns at different discussion programmes in the city arranged for marking the 64th birth anniversary of Sheikh Hasina, also president of AL.

Speaking at a discussion at the National Press Club, Sajeda, who is deputy leader of the parliament, said the war criminals did not sit idle. They have been conspiring one after another. "So, Awami League is concerned over the security of Sheikh Hasina's life."

Tk 6,446cr projects taken to modernise telecom, JS told

One laptop to be available at Tk 10,000 within 6 months, says Raziuddin

The government has taken seven mega projects involving Tk 6, 446 crore for modernisation and improvement of telecommunications sector in efforts to build "digital Bangladesh," a major electoral pledge of the of Tk 290.65 crore. ruling Awami League.

Replying to lawmakers' queries, Post and Telecommunications Minister Raziuddin Ahmed Raju told the House yesterday.

He also said a laptop at a cost of Tk 10,000 only will be available in the market within next six months. Issuance of license for VoIP business will begin from coming November, he added.

The minister said the seven projects, which are now at different stages for approval, are set to be implemented by 2015.

The mega project includes setting up next generation network (NGN) based telecommu-

nications network at a cost of Tk 1725.39 crore, setting up broadband wireless network at a cost of Tk 549.17 crore, improvement of optical fiber cable network at 1,000 union parishad at a cost of Tk 759.87 crore, expanding the internet information network at a cost The other mega projects involving Tk

1909.67 crore was taken to introduce 3A network and expanding of 2.5A network to improve services of Teletalk, the only staterun mobile phone company.

Two other projects were taken to improve postal department, which includes building of post e-centre for community at a cost of Tk 597.41 and setting up information technology based rural post offices.

In another reply, the minister said the government is considering to expand land phone up to village level through wireless high-technology (CDMAWLL) system.

CUSTODIAL DEATH Suo moto rule on govt to explain by Oct 5

The High Court yesterday issued a suo moto rule upon the government to explain by October 5 why it should not be directed to take legal action against the ones responsible for the custodial death of Md Idris, a rickshawpuller, in Chittagong.

The court also directed the authorities concerned to submit a report after investigating the death of Idris within the next seven days.

A division bench comprising of Justice Mamnoon Rahman and Justice Syeda Afsar Jahan issued the order following newspaper reports on death of Idris in police custody.

The home secretary, inspector general of police, inspector general of prisons, commissioner of Chittagong Metropolitan Police and officerin-charge of Bayezid Bostami Police Station were made respondents to the rule.

According to reports, rickshaw puller Md Idris, 35, died in Chittagong Central Jail last Monday. The victim's mother Nurjahan Begum alleged brutal torture in police custody led to herson's death.

Idris, who was accused of stealing a motorbike, was hauled by the police on September 14 and taken to Bayezid Bostami Police Station from where he was sent to prison the following day.

Suo moto, meaning "on its own motion," is a Latin legal term used where a government agency acts on its own cognisance.

Duke sent to jail

A Dhaka court yesterday sent Saiful Islam Duke, nephew of BNP Chairperson Khaleda Zia, to jail in connection with the August 21, 2004 grenade attack case on Awami League rally.

Third Additional Chief Metropolitan Magistrate Mohammad Ali Hussain passed the order after Criminal Investigation Department (CID) produced Duke before it on completion of his two-day remand.

The order came when Investigation Officer (IO) of the case, Abdul Kahar Akond, CID's special superintendent of police, did not seek further remand for interrogation. In the forwarding report, the

IO appealed to the court to confine Duke in jail, as police are verifying the information gleaned from him.

Duke was arrested on August 26 for his alleged involvement in the August 21 grenade attack that killed 24 AL leaders and activists and injured 200 more.
